## House Bill 3428

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Requires district attorney to investigate residency status of convicted persons. Requires district attorney to take all reasonable steps to transfer custody of convicted aliens to federal government.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to criminal aliens.
  - Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
    - <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) When a person is convicted of a crime, the district attorney shall conduct an investigation to determine if the convicted person is present in the United States in violation of federal immigration laws.
    - (2) If the district attorney has reasonable grounds to believe that the convicted person is present in the United States in violation of federal immigration laws, the district attorney shall notify United States Immigration and Customs Enforcement of the grounds supporting that belief and request the federal agency's assistance in confirming the person's legal status.
    - (3) If the federal agency confirms that the convicted person is present in the United States in violation of federal immigration laws, the district attorney shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that the federal agency takes physical and legal custody of the convicted person.
