## House Bill 3431

Sponsored by Representative HUNT; Representatives BARKER, CLEM, GALIZIO, Senators BROWN, WESTLUND (at the request of Oregon Council of Police Associations, Association of Oregon Corrections Employees)

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Establishes procedure for suspension or revocation of certifications of instructors and public safety officers by Department of Public Safety Standards and Training.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- Relating to the Department of Public Safety Standards and Training; amending ORS 181.661.
- Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
  - **SECTION 1.** ORS 181.661 is amended to read:

181.661. (1) [When] If the Department of Public Safety Standards and Training denies an application [or certification or the department or Board on Public Safety Standards and Training believes there is a reasonable basis for suspending or revoking the] for certification of an instructor or a public safety officer, [except a youth correction officer or fire service professional,] notice and opportunity for a hearing shall be provided in accordance [with rules approved by the board and in accordance] with ORS 183.415 [prior to suspension or revocation].

(2) If staff of the department believe that there are grounds for suspension or revocation of the certification of an instructor or a public safety officer, the staff shall make a report to the appropriate policy committee established under ORS 181.637. If the policy committee believes that there are grounds for suspension or revocation of the certification, the policy committee shall give written notice to the instructor or public safety officer that the certification of the instructor or public safety officer will be revoked unless the instructor or public safety officer requests a hearing within 20 days after delivery of the notice. If a hearing is not requested, the department shall enter a final order suspending or revoking the certification. If a hearing is requested, the hearing shall be conducted as a contested case under ORS chapter 183 by an administrative law judge from the Office of Administrative Hearings, and a copy of the proposed order of the administrative law judge shall be served on the Board on Public Safety Standards and Training. The board may modify the proposed order as allowed under ORS 183.650.
