

House Bill 3456

Sponsored by Representative BUTLER

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Directs Oregon Department of Administrative Services to sell Timms Hamby Computer Archive Center to Burns Paiute Tribe.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

1
2 Relating to Timms Hamby Computer Archive Center; and declaring an emergency.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. The Legislative Assembly finds that:**

5 (1) **The Timms Hamby Computer Archive Center located in Burns, Oregon, is underuti-**
6 **lized.**

7 (2) **The welfare of residents of rural Indian reservations is acutely dependent upon the**
8 **growth, development and expansion of employment and business opportunities.**

9 (3) **The Burns Paiute Tribe, a federally recognized Indian tribe, and its Wa-Da' Corpo-**
10 **ration have the knowledge and experience to fully utilize the Timms Hamby Computer Ar-**
11 **chive Center and can use the center to pursue rural business development.**

12 **SECTION 2. (1) The Oregon Department of Administrative Services shall sell the Timms**
13 **Hamby Computer Archive Center located in Burns, Oregon, to the Burns Paiute Tribe and**
14 **its Wa-Da' Corporation for the consideration of \$1.**

15 (2) **The sale and transfer of the center shall be completed on or before January 1, 2008.**

16 **SECTION 3. This 2007 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**
17 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2007 Act takes effect**
18 **on its passage.**
