House Bill 3472

Sponsored by Representative CANNON; Representatives BUCKLEY, CLEM, DALLUM, GIROD, HUNT, JENSON, MAURER, READ, RICHARDSON, G SMITH

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Provides that per diem payments to member of Legislative Assembly be based on distance between member's district residence and State Capitol.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to members of the Legislative Assembly; creating new provisions; and amending ORS
 171.072.

4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

5 **SECTION 1.** ORS 171.072 is amended to read:

6 171.072. (1) A member of the Legislative Assembly shall receive for services an annual salary 7 of the greater of:

8 (a) One step below the maximum of Salary Range 1 in the Management Service Compensation
9 Plan in the executive department as defined in ORS 174.112; or

10 (b) Seventeen percent of the salary of a Circuit Court Judge.

11 (2) The President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives each shall re-12 ceive for services, as additional salary, an amount equal to the sum allowed each of them as a 13 member under subsection (1) of this section.

(3) A member of the Legislative Assembly shall receive, as an allowance for expenses not otherwise provided for, a per diem determined as provided in subsection (9) of this section for each day within the period that the Legislative Assembly is in session, to be paid with the salary provided for in subsection (1) of this section. Pursuant to procedures determined by the Legislative Administration Committee, a member may draw from an accrued allowance.

19 (4) A member of the Legislative Assembly shall receive, as an allowance for expenses incurred 20 in the performance of official duties during periods when the legislature is not in session, \$400 for 21each calendar month or part of a calendar month during those periods, to be paid monthly, and 22subject to approval of the President of the Senate or Speaker of the House of Representatives, 23mileage expenses and a per diem determined as provided in subsection (9) of this section for each day a member is engaged in the business of legislative interim and statutory committees, including 24advisory committees and subcommittees of advisory committees, and task forces and for each day 25 26 a member serves on interstate bodies, advisory committees and other entities on which the member serves ex officio, whether or not the entity is a legislative one. 27

(5) In addition to the mileage and per diem expense payments provided by this section, a member
of the Legislative Assembly may receive reimbursement for actual and necessary expenses, subject
to approval by the President of the Senate or Speaker of the House of Representatives, for legislative business outside of the state.

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1 (6) The President of the Senate and Speaker of the House of Representatives may delegate to 2 the chairpersons of interim and statutory committees and task forces the approval authority granted 3 to them by subsection (4) of this section, with respect to expenses incurred in attending any meeting 4 of a particular committee or task force.

(7) Amounts received under subsections (3) to (5) of this section are excluded from gross income 5 and expenditures of the amounts are excluded in computing deductions for purposes of ORS chapter 6 316. If there is attached to the personal income return a schedule of all ordinary and necessary 7 business expenses paid during the tax year as a member of the Legislative Assembly, a deduction 8 9 may be claimed on the return for legislative expenses paid in excess of the amounts received under subsections (3) to (5) of this section. Expenses of members of the Legislative Assembly that are re-10 imbursed by the state for actual expenses for meals and lodging associated with state travel for the 11 12 same period during which a legislator receives per diem is subject to state income tax.

(8) For periods when the Legislative Assembly is not in session, the Legislative Administration Committee shall provide for a telephone and an expense allowance for members of the Legislative Assembly that is in addition to the amount allowed under subsection (4) of this section. In determining the amount of allowance for members, the committee shall consider the geographic area of the member's district. The additional allowance shall reflect travel expenses necessary to communicate in districts of varying sizes.

19 [(9) The per diem allowance referred to in subsections (3) and (4) of this section shall be the amount 20 fixed for per diem allowance that is authorized by the United States Internal Revenue Service to be 21 excluded from gross income without itemization.]

(9) The per diem allowance referred to in subsections (3) and (4) of this section shall be:
(a) \$_____, for any member whose district residence is within 50 miles of the State
Capitol;

(b) \$_____, for any member whose district residence is within 100 miles of the State
Capitol;

(c) \$_____, for any member whose district residence is within 150 miles of the State
Capitol;

(d) \$_____, for any member whose district residence is more than 150 miles from the
State Capitol.

31 <u>SECTION 2.</u> The amendments to ORS 171.072 by section 1 of this 2007 Act apply to all 32 per diem amounts for service by a member of the Legislative Assembly on or after the ef-33 fective date of this 2007 Act.

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
