SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

[Lengthens rotation cycle for harvesting timber on lands not eligible for special assessments from 12 years to 20 years.]

[Applies to assessments of forestland for property tax years beginning on or after July 1, 2008.]

Creates Task Force on Oregon's Hybrid Poplar Industry. Specifies membership and duties of task force.

Sunsets on convening of next regular biennial legislative session. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to timber; and declaring an emergency.
 - Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
 - <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) There is created the Task Force on Oregon's Hybrid Poplar Industry, consisting of seven members. The Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President of the Senate shall jointly appoint:
 - (a) One member of the House of Representatives.
- 8 **(b) One member of the Senate.**
- (c) One member who is a grower of hybrid poplar trees from western Oregon.
- 10 (d) One member who is a grower of hybrid poplar trees from eastern Oregon.
- 11 (e) One member who is a member of the Oregon Forest Industries Council.
- 12 (f) One member who is a member of the Oregon Small Woodlands Association.
 - (g) One member who is a member of the Oregon Farm Bureau.
 - (2) The task force shall study Oregon's hybrid poplar tree industry and review laws and rules, specifically those relating to tax assessment and various regulatory issues, that affect the hybrid poplar industry.
 - (3) A majority of the members of the task force constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business.
- 19 (4) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority of the members 20 of the task force.
 - (5) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson.
 - (6) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority shall make an appointment to become immediately effective.
 - (7) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson or of a majority of the members of the task force.

NOTE: Matter in **boldfaced** type in an amended section is new; matter [italic and bracketed] is existing law to be omitted. New sections are in **boldfaced** type.

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- (8) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task force.
- (9) The task force shall submit a report, and may include recommendations for legislation, to an interim committee related to forests and forest products as appropriate no later than December 1, 2007.
- (10) To the greatest extent practicable, the State Forestry Department shall provide staff support to the task force.
- (11) Members of the task force are not entitled to compensation or reimbursement for expenses and serve as volunteers on the task force.
- (12) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist the task force in the performance of its duties and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to furnish such information and advice as the members of the task force consider necessary to perform their duties.
- SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2007 Act is repealed on the date of the convening of the next regular biennial legislative session.
- SECTION 3. This 2007 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2007 Act takes effect on its passage.
