SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Directs Department of Human Services to develop plan to slow rate of diabetes by 2010. Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2007.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to diabetes; and declaring an emergency.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> Section 2 of this 2007 Act is added to and made a part of ORS chapter 431.

5 SECTION 2. (1) The Department of Human Services shall develop a strategic plan to slow

6 the rate of diabetes caused by obesity and other environmental factors by the year 2010.

- 7 (2) The department shall collaborate with the Oregon Diabetes Coalition and others such 8 as:
- 9 (a) Health care professionals and researchers specializing in diabetes treatment or re-10 search;

11 (b) Diabetes educators;

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- 12 (c) Representatives of medical schools or schools of public health;
- 13 (d) High school and post-secondary institution health educators;
- (e) Representatives from geographic areas and other population groups at higher risk of
 diabetes;
- (f) Representatives of community-based organizations involved in providing education
 about or awareness of diabetes; and
- 18 (g) Other individuals the department determines are necessary.
- 19 (3) In developing the plan, the department shall:
- 20 (a) Identify barriers to effective screening compliance and treatment for diabetes, in-21 cluding specific barriers affecting providers and patients;

(b) Identify methods to increase the number of patients who will screen regularly for
 diabetes;

(c) Review current medical therapies and best clinical practices for diabetes, including
 the American Diabetes Association clinical measures and recommendations;

- (d) Review medications available to control diabetes, including those that are provided
 upon failure of oral medications and as ancillary to the provision of insulin;
- (e) Review current screening, treatment and related activities in this state and identify
 gaps in service delivery, use of technology or use of current clinical measures and guidelines
 such as those promulgated by the American Diabetes Association;

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1 (f) Identify actions to be taken to reduce the morbidity and mortality from diabetes by 2 the year 2010 and a time frame for taking those actions; and

3 (g) Make recommendations to the Seventy-fifth Legislative Assembly on statutory
 4 changes and funding needed to achieve the department's plan.

5 SECTION 3. Section 2 of this 2007 Act is repealed on January 1, 2010.

6 <u>SECTION 4.</u> This 2007 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 7 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2007 Act takes effect 8 July 1, 2007.

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
