SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Creates crime of online sexual corruption of child in second degree. Punishes by maximum of five years' imprisonment, \$125,000 fine, or both.

Čreates crime of online sexual corruption of child in first degree. Punishes by maximum of 10 years' imprisonment, \$250,000 fine, or both.

Requires person convicted of online sexual corruption of child in any degree to report as sex offender and authorizes seizure of instrumentalities of crime.

3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. As used in sections 2 to 4 of this 2007 Act:
5	(1) "Child" means a person who the defendant reasonably believes to be under 16 years
6	of age.
7	(2) "Online communication" means communication that occurs via electronic mail, per-
8	sonal or instant messaging, chat rooms, bulletin boards or any other method of communi-
9	cating over the Internet.
10	(3) "Sexual contact" has the meaning given that term in ORS 163.305.
11	(4) "Sexually explicit conduct" has the meaning given that term in ORS 163.665.
12	(5) "Solicit" means to invite, request, seduce, lure, entice, persuade, prevail upon, coax,
13	coerce or attempt to do so.
14	SECTION 2. (1) A person commits the crime of online sexual corruption of a child in the
15	second degree if the person is 18 years of age or older and, for the purpose of arousing or
16	gratifying the sexual desire of the person or another person, knowingly uses an online com-
17	munication to solicit a child to engage in sexual contact or sexually explicit conduct.
18	(2) Online sexual corruption of a child in the second degree is a Class C felony.
19	SECTION 3. (1) A person commits the crime of online sexual corruption of a child in the
20	first degree if the person violates section 2 of this 2007 Act and intentionally takes a sub-
21	stantial step toward physically meeting with or encountering the child.
22	(2) Online sexual corruption of a child in the first degree is a Class B felony.
23	SECTION 4. (1) It is an affirmative defense to a prosecution for online sexual corruption
24	of a child in the first or second degree that the person was not more than three years older

than the person reasonably believed the child to be. 1

2 (2) It is not a defense to a prosecution for online sexual corruption of a child in the first or second degree that the person was in fact communicating with a law enforcement officer, 3 as defined in ORS 163.730, or a person working under the direction of a law enforcement of-4 ficer, who is 16 years of age or older. 5

(3) Online sexual corruption of a child in the first or second degree is committed in either 6 the county in which the communication originated or the county in which the communi-7 cation was received. 8
