House Joint Memorial 6

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Urges Congress to support establishment of Ice Age Floods National Geologic Trail.

1	JOINT MEMORIAL
2	To the President of the United States and the Senate and the House of Representatives of the United
3	States of America, in Congress assembled:
4	We, your memorialists, the Seventy-fourth Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon, in leg-
5	islative session assembled, respectfully represent as follows:
6	Whereas the Ice Age Floods Study of Alternatives and Environmental Assessment recommends
7	that the Ice Age Floods National Geologic Trail be established by the Congress of the United States
8	of America to follow the floods' pathways; and
9	Whereas the floods are responsible for shaping a fascinating landscape that spans much of
10	Oregon, from Juniper Canyon in the northeast to the cities of Astoria and Warrenton on the Pacific
11	coast; and
12	Whereas the landscape and its natural history stimulate interest in the region and benefit local
13	economies by attracting recreationists, tourists and scientists; and
14	Whereas many of the locations for proposed touring routes, interpretive facilities and other re-
15	sources related to the ice age floods are already on public lands and near, or visible from, public
16	roadways; and
17	Whereas the trail, as envisioned, is to be a collaborative effort of public and private entities
18	coordinated by the National Park Service; and
19	Whereas the National Park Service's Special Resource Study titled "Ice Age Floods Study of
20	Alternatives and Environmental Assessment: Following the Pathways of the Glacial Lake Missoula
21	Floods" recommends that the National Park Service acquire no more than 25 acres for use in the
22	trail; now, therefore,
23	Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:
24	That we, the members of the Seventy-fourth Legislative Assembly, respectfully request that the
25	Congress of the United States support the establishment of the Ice Age Floods National Geologic
26	Trail; and be it further
27	Resolved, That a copy of this memorial shall be sent to the President of the United States, to
28	the Senate Majority Leader, to the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and to each member

of the Oregon Congressional Delegation.
