SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Encourages early screening and aggressive treatment programs for diabetes.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 1 2 Whereas diabetes is a chronic disease for which there is currently no known cure and is the sixth leading cause of death in this country; and 3 Whereas the serious long term implications of high blood sugar levels caused by diabetes may 4 include blindness, lower extremity amputation, heart disease, kidney failure and premature death; $\mathbf{5}$ 6 and 7 Whereas in recent years the number of individuals diagnosed with diabetes has increased 41 8 percent; and Whereas nine out of 10 adults who are newly diagnosed with adult onset diabetes are obese; and 9 Whereas this country faces a diabetes epidemic because an estimated 20.8 million Americans are 10 living with diabetes; and 11 12 Whereas the keys to reducing the incidence of and complications associated with diabetes are education, early detection, control of blood sugar and proper treatment; and 1314 Whereas the first line of recommended treatment is diet, exercise and weight loss; now, therefore, 15 Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Oregon: 16 17That we, the members of the House of Representatives of the Seventy-fourth Legislative Assembly, encourage all Oregonians to seek early screening for diabetes and encourage health care 18 19 providers to engage in aggressive programs with their diabetic patients, including dietary coun-

20 seling, instructions on proper exercise and measurements of body weight.

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
