SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Extends statute of limitations from 10 years to 12 years for action for recovery of real property or for recovery of possession of real property.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to statute of limitations; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 12.050.
 - Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
 - **SECTION 1.** ORS 12.050 is amended to read:
 - 12.050. An action for the recovery of real property, or for the recovery of the possession thereof, shall be commenced within [10] 12 years. [No] An action [shall] may not be maintained for such recovery unless it [appear] appears that the plaintiff, an ancestor, a predecessor[,] or a grantor was seized or possessed of the premises in question within [10] 12 years before the commencement of the action.
 - SECTION 2. The amendments to ORS 12.050 by section 1 of this 2007 Act apply to any action commenced as described in ORS 12.020 on or after the effective date of this 2007 Act.
