## Senate Bill 312

Sponsored by Senator BROWN for Oregon Association for Talented and Gifted (OATAG) (Presession filed.)

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** 

Requires school districts to submit written plan of instruction for talented and gifted children to Superintendent of Public Instruction for approval.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2007.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to school districts; creating new provisions; amending ORS 343.397; and declaring an emergency.
- 4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
  - **SECTION 1.** ORS 343.397 is amended to read:
- 343.397. [Any] **A** school district [may] **shall** submit to the Superintendent of Public Instruction for approval a written plan of instruction for talented and gifted children. The plan shall include,
- 8 but not be limited to:
  - (1) A statement of school district policy on the education of talented and gifted children;
- 10 (2) An assessment of current special programs and services provided by the district for talented 11 and gifted children;
  - (3) A statement of district goals for providing comprehensive special programs and services and over what span of time the goals will be achieved;
  - (4) A description of the nature of the special programs and services which will be provided to accomplish the goals; and
  - (5) A plan for evaluating progress on the district plan including each component program and service.
  - SECTION 2. The amendments to ORS 343.397 by section 1 of this 2007 Act first apply to the 2007-2008 school year.
  - <u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2007 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2007 Act takes effect July 1, 2007.

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
