SENATE AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 406

On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 4 through 30 and delete page 2 and insert: 1 2 "SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section, 'humane investigation agency' means a private, 3 nonprofit animal care agency that has maintained an animal welfare investigation department for at least five years and has had officers commissioned as special agents by the 4 $\mathbf{5}$ Governor. 6 "(2) Upon the request of a humane investigation agency, the Governor may commission 7 persons designated by the humane investigation agency who shall have the powers of peace officers and, after being commissioned, may act as peace officers to enforce ORS 167.310 to 8 9 167.351, 167.334, 167.352, 167.355, 167.360 to 167.375, 167.385, 167.387, 167.388 and 167.390. 10 "(3) Special agents commissioned under this section serve at the pleasure of the Gover-11 nor. The Governor may, for any reason and at any time, refuse to commission a person as 12a special agent or revoke a previously granted commission. 13 "(4) A special agent serves at the expense of the humane investigation agency. 14 "(5) A humane investigation agency employing a special agent is civilly responsible for 15any abuse of the special agent's authority. "(6) Before a commission described in subsection (2) of this section becomes effective: 16 17 "(a) The humane investigation agency must enter into a contract with the State of 18 Oregon. The contract may provide: 19 "(A) For guidelines and policies to be followed by the humane investigation agency and 20 commissioned special agents; 21"(B) That the humane investigation agency will assume liability for the actions of the 22special agent and will indemnify and hold harmless the State of Oregon and its agents and 23 employees from any claims that arise from the activities of the special agent; 24 "(C) That the humane investigation agency will obtain insurance coverage to cover 25claims that arise from the actions of a commissioned special agent; and 26 "(D) That the humane investigation agency will provide to the State of Oregon sufficient 27supporting documentation regarding the insurance coverage. 28"(b) The person who seeks to be commissioned as a special agent must: 29"(A) Consent to a background investigation; and "(B) Sign an oath of office, provided by the Governor, that requires the person to support 30 31 the Constitution of the United States, the Constitution of Oregon and the laws thereof, and 32to faithfully discharge the duties of a special agent.". 33
