## Senate Bill 420

Sponsored by Senator GORDLY

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** 

Creates Environmental Justice Task Force. Specifies duties and responsibilities. Requires natural resource agencies to perform certain actions relating to environmental justice. Defines "natural resource agency."

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to environmental justice.

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**3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:** 

SECTION 1. For purposes of sections 1 to 5 of this 2007 Act, "natural resource agency" 4 means the Department of Environmental Quality, the State Department of Agriculture, the  $\mathbf{5}$ Water Resources Department, the State Department of Fish and Wildlife, the State Forestry 6 Department, the Department of State Lands, the Department of Education, the State De-7 8 partment of Geology and Mineral Industries, the Department of Land Conservation and Development, the State Marine Board, the Public Utility Commission, the Department of 9 Transportation, the State Fire Marshal and the Department of Human Services. 10 SECTION 2. (1) There is established the Environmental Justice Task Force consisting of 11 12 12 members appointed by the Governor. The members shall be persons who are well-informed on the principles of environmental justice and who, to the greatest extent practicable, rep-13resent minority communities, low-income communities, environmental interests, industry 14 groups and geographically diverse areas of the state. Of the 12 members, the Governor shall 15

16 appoint one member of the task force from each of the following commissions:

- 17 (a) The Commission on Asian Affairs;
- 18 (b) The Commission on Black Affairs;
- 19 (c) The Commission on Hispanic Affairs; and
- 20 (d) The Commission on Indian Services.

(2) The task force shall submit an annual report to the Governor setting forth its view
of the progress of natural resource agencies toward achieving the goals established pursuant
to section 3 of this 2007 Act and identifying any other environmental issues that the task
force determines need attention.

(3) The term of office of each member is four years, but a member serves at the pleasure
of the Governor. Before the expiration of the term of a member, the Governor shall appoint
a successor whose term begins on January 1 of the following year. A member may be reappointed. If there is a vacancy for any cause, the Governor shall make an appointment to
become immediately effective for the unexpired term.

(4) A member of the task force who is not a member of the Legislative Assembly is en titled to compensation and expenses in the manner and amounts provided for in ORS 292.495.

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1 Claims for compensation and expenses incurred in performing functions of the task force 2 shall be paid out of funds appropriated to the Governor for that purpose.

3 (5) The task force shall elect one of its members as a chairperson and another as vice
4 chairperson, for the terms and with the duties and powers necessary for the performance
5 of the functions of such offices as the task force determines.

6 (6) A majority of the members of the task force constitutes a quorum for the transaction 7 of business.

8 (7) The task force shall meet at least once every three months at times and places 9 specified by the chairperson. The task force also shall meet at other times and places speci-10 fied by the call of the chairperson or of a majority of the members of the task force.

(8) The Governor shall provide the task force with the necessary clerical and adminis trative staff support.

(9) Natural resource agencies are directed to assist the task force in the performance of its duties and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to furnish such information and advice as the members of the task force consider necessary to perform their duties.

(10) A member of the task force who is a member of the Legislative Assembly may serve
 in an advisory capacity only.

19 <u>SECTION 3.</u> The Environmental Justice Task Force shall:

20 (1) Advise the Governor on environmental justice issues;

(2) Advise natural resource agencies on environmental justice issues, including commu nity concerns and public participation processes;

(3) Identify, in cooperation with natural resource agencies, minority and low-income
 communities that may be affected by environmental decisions made by the agencies;

(4) Meet with environmental justice communities and make recommendations to the
 Governor regarding concerns raised by these communities; and

27 (5) Define environmental justice issues in the state.

28 <u>SECTION 4.</u> In order to provide greater public participation and to ensure that all per-29 sons affected by decisions of the natural resource agencies have a voice in those decisions, 30 each natural resource agency shall:

(1) In making a determination whether and how to act, consider the effects of the action
 on environmental justice issues.

(2) Hold hearings at times and in locations that are convenient for people in the com munities that will be affected by the decisions stemming from the hearings.

(3) Engage in public outreach activities in the communities that will be affected by deci sions of the agency.

37 (4) Create a citizen advocate position that is responsible for:

38 (a) Encouraging public participation;

39 (b) Ensuring that the agency considers environmental justice issues; and

40 (c) Informing the agency of the effect of its decisions on communities traditionally
 41 underrepresented in public processes.

42 <u>SECTION 5.</u> All directors of natural resource agencies, and other agency directors as the 43 Governor may designate, shall report annually to the Environmental Justice Task Force and 44 to the Governor on the results of the agencies' efforts to:

45 (1) Address environmental justice issues;

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1 (2) Increase public participation of individuals and communities affected by agencies' de- $\mathbf{2}$ cisions; 3 (3) Determine the effect of the agencies' decisions on traditionally underrepresented communities; and 4  $\mathbf{5}$ (4) Improve plans to further the progress of environmental justice in Oregon. 6 SECTION 6. Notwithstanding the term of office specified in section 2 of this 2007 Act, of the members first appointed to the Environmental Justice Task Force under section 2 of this 72007 Act: 8 9 (1) Four shall serve for terms ending June 30, 2009.

10 (2) Four shall serve for terms ending June 30, 2010.

- 11 (3) Four shall serve for terms ending June 30, 2011.
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
