

Senate Bill 424

Sponsored by Senator METSGER

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Conforms Oregon Vehicle Code to provisions of federal Real ID Act of 2005.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to federal Real ID Act of 2005; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 802.195, 802.200, 807.024, 807.040, 807.050, 807.110, 807.115, 807.130, 807.162, 807.400, 811.603, 811.604 and 811.605.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2007 Act is added to and made a part of the Oregon Vehicle Code.

SECTION 2. (1) Prior to issuing, renewing or replacing any driver license, driver permit or identification card, the Department of Transportation shall require a person to provide proof of legal presence and a Social Security number or, if the person is not eligible for a Social Security number, an identifying number issued by the United States Department of Homeland Security and proof that the person is not eligible for a Social Security number.

(2) For the purposes of subsection (1) of this section:

(a) A person provides proof of legal presence by submitting valid documentation, as defined by rule, that the person is a citizen or permanent legal resident of the United States or is otherwise legally present in the United States in accordance with federal immigration laws.

(b) A person satisfies the requirement of providing proof of a Social Security number by submitting a valid Social Security number that has been assigned to the person by the United States Social Security Administration.

(c) If a person is not eligible to have a Social Security number, the person shall provide proof, as defined by rule, that the person is not eligible for a Social Security number.

(d) A person satisfies the requirement of providing an identifying number issued by the United States Department of Homeland Security by submitting an acceptable document, as defined by rule, that includes the identifying number.

(e) A temporary driver license grants the same privileges as a driver license. The term "temporary driver license" may be used interchangeably with driver license when referring to a document issued by this state as evidence of a grant of driving privileges.

(3)(a) The Department of Transportation may issue a temporary driver license, temporary driver permit or temporary identification card only to a person who provides proof, as determined by rule, that the person is legally present in the United States on a temporary basis.

(b) A temporary driver license, temporary driver permit or temporary identification card

1 shall be valid only during the period of time of the applicant's authorized stay in the United
2 States or, if there is no definite end to the period of authorized stay, for a period of one year.

3 (c) A temporary driver license, temporary driver permit or temporary identification card
4 may be renewed only upon presentation of acceptable documentation, as determined by rule,
5 that the status by which the applicant qualified for the temporary driver license, temporary
6 driver permit or temporary identification card has been extended by the United States De-
7 partment of Homeland Security.

8 (d) A temporary driver license or temporary driver permit grants the same privileges as
9 a driver license or driver permit.

10 (e) A temporary identification card shall bear a statement to the effect that the tempo-
11 rary identification card is not a license or any other grant of driving privileges and is to be
12 used for identification purposes only.

13 (f) The fees for issuance, renewal and replacement of temporary driver licenses and
14 temporary driver permits under this section are as provided under ORS 807.370 for the cor-
15 responding nontemporary license or permit. The fees for issuance, renewal and replacement
16 of temporary identification cards under this section are as provided under ORS 807.410 for
17 the corresponding nontemporary identification card.

18 (4) The Department of Transportation may issue, renew or replace a driver license,
19 driver permit or identification card only after the department verifies the Social Security
20 number with the United States Social Security Administration or verifies the identifying
21 number provided under subsection (2)(d) of this section with the United States Department
22 of Homeland Security.

23 (5) Subsections (1) and (4) of this section do not apply if the Department of Transporta-
24 tion previously verified information as required by subsection (4) of this section and the
25 person applying for the driver license, driver permit or identification card is a citizen or
26 permanent legal resident of the United States.

27 **SECTION 3.** Section 2 of this 2007 Act applies to driver licenses, driver permits and
28 identification cards that are issued, renewed or replaced on or after May 11, 2008.

29 **SECTION 4.** ORS 802.195 is amended to read:

30 802.195. (1) As used in this section:

31 (a) "Motor vehicle record" means any record that pertains to a grant of driving privileges, an
32 identification card issued by the Department of Transportation, a vehicle title or a vehicle regis-
33 tration.

34 (b) "Person" has the meaning given that term in ORS 802.175.

35 (2) Neither the Department of Transportation nor any officer, employee or contractor of the
36 department may knowingly disclose or otherwise make available to any person an individual's Social
37 Security number, **or an individual's identifying number issued by the United States Depart-**
38 **ment of Homeland Security**, that is obtained by the Department of Transportation in connection
39 with a motor vehicle record.

40 (3) Notwithstanding subsection (2) of this section, the Department of Transportation may, upon
41 the request of another government agency, or shall, as required by law, disclose an individual's So-
42 cial Security number, **or an individual's identifying number issued by the United States De-**
43 **partment of Homeland Security**, from a motor vehicle record to the other agency for use in
44 carrying out the other agency's governmental functions.

45 (4) An Oregon government agency that receives an individual's Social Security number, **or an**

1 **individual's identifying number issued by the United States Department of Homeland Secu-**
 2 **urity**, under subsection (3) of this section may not redisclose the Social Security number **or identi-**
 3 **fyng number** except as required by law. An Oregon government agency that rediscloses a Social
 4 Security number **or identifying number** as authorized by this subsection shall keep for five years
 5 records that identify each other government agency that receives the Social Security number **or**
 6 **identifying number**. Records kept in accordance with this subsection must be made available to the
 7 Department **of Transportation** upon request.

8 (5) The Department **of Transportation** may establish fees reasonably calculated to reimburse
 9 the department for the actual cost of making an individual's Social Security number, **or an indi-**
 10 **vidual's identifying number issued by the United States Department of Homeland Security**,
 11 available to a government agency as required in subsection (3) of this section.

12 (6) Nothing in this section prohibits an individual from having access to that individual's own
 13 Social Security number, **or the individual's identifying number issued by the United States**
 14 **Department of Homeland Security**, that is contained in motor vehicle records.

15 (7) Knowingly obtaining or using a Social Security number, **or an individual's identifying**
 16 **number issued by the United States Department of Homeland Security**, from a motor vehicle
 17 record in violation of this section is a Class A misdemeanor.

18 (8) A person aggrieved by violation of this section may bring a civil action against a person who
 19 has knowingly obtained or used the aggrieved person's Social Security number, **or the aggrieved**
 20 **person's identifying number issued by the United States Department of Homeland Security**,
 21 in violation of this section. The action shall be for actual damages or \$2,500, whichever is greater,
 22 plus attorney fees and court costs reasonably incurred in the action.

23 (9) A person aggrieved by a violation of this section, a district attorney or the Attorney General
 24 may obtain appropriate relief to enforce this section, together with attorney fees and costs reason-
 25 ably incurred in an action.

26 (10) Any person whose use or acquisition of a Social Security number, **or an identifying**
 27 **number issued by the United States Department of Homeland Security**, in violation of this
 28 section subjects the State of Oregon to any liability or claim shall indemnify and hold harmless this
 29 state from all such liabilities and claims, including attorney fees and court costs, incurred in any
 30 action brought under this section.

31 **SECTION 5.** ORS 802.200 is amended to read:

32 802.200. In addition to any other records the Department of Transportation may establish, the
 33 department is subject to the following provisions concerning records:

34 (1) The department shall maintain records concerning the titling of vehicles in this state. The
 35 records under this subsection shall include the following:

36 (a) For vehicles issued a title by this state, the records shall identify the vehicle and contain
 37 the following:

38 (A) The name of the vehicle owner and any security interest holders in order of priority, except
 39 that a security interest holder need not be identified if the debtor who granted the interest is in the
 40 business of selling vehicles and the vehicles constitute inventory held for sale;

41 (B) The name of any lessor of the vehicle;

42 (C) The vehicle description; and

43 (D) Whether a certificate of title was issued for the vehicle.

44 (b) If the vehicle is an antique vehicle that is reconstructed, the records shall indicate that the
 45 vehicle is reconstructed.

1 (c) If the vehicle is a replica, the records shall indicate that the vehicle is a replica.

2 (d) Any other information concerning the titling of vehicles that the department considers con-
3 venient or appropriate.

4 (e) All odometer readings for a vehicle that are reported to the department under provisions of
5 the vehicle code.

6 (f) If the vehicle has been reported to the department as a totaled vehicle under the provisions
7 of ORS 819.012 or 819.014, the records shall indicate that the vehicle is a totaled vehicle unless the
8 reason for the report was theft and the vehicle has been recovered.

9 (2) If a vehicle that has been registered or titled in another jurisdiction is registered or titled
10 in this state, the department shall retain a record of any odometer readings shown on the title or
11 registration documents submitted to the department at the time of registration or title.

12 (3) Except as otherwise provided in ORS 826.003, the department shall maintain records con-
13 cerning the registration of vehicles required to be registered by the department. The records con-
14 cerning the registration of vehicles may be stored along with records concerning the titling of
15 vehicles. The records under this subsection shall include the following:

16 (a) For vehicles registered by the department, the records shall identify the vehicle and contain
17 the following:

18 (A) The registration plate number assigned by the department to the vehicle;

19 (B) The name of the vehicle owner;

20 (C) The vehicle description and vehicle identification number; and

21 (D) An indication that the vehicle is a totaled vehicle if it has been reported to the department
22 as a totaled vehicle under the provisions of ORS 819.012 or 819.014, unless the reason for the report
23 was theft and the vehicle has been recovered.

24 (b) Any other information concerning the registration of vehicles that the department considers
25 convenient or appropriate.

26 (4) The department shall maintain separate records for the regulation of vehicle dealers. The
27 records required under this subsection shall include the following information about persons issued
28 dealer certificates:

29 (a) The person's application for a vehicle dealer certificate.

30 (b) An alphabetical index of the name of each person applying for a vehicle dealer certificate.

31 (c) A numerical index according to the distinctive number assigned to each vehicle dealer.

32 (5) The department shall maintain a file on vehicles for which the title record is canceled under
33 ORS 819.030. The records required under this subsection shall disclose the last registered owner of
34 each vehicle, any security interest holder or holders and lessors of each vehicle as shown by the
35 canceled title record for each vehicle and the make and year model for each vehicle.

36 (6) The department shall maintain a record of each agreement or declaration under ORS 802.500
37 and 802.520.

38 (7) The department shall maintain separate and comprehensive records of all transactions af-
39 fecting the Revolving Account for Emergency Cash Advances described under ORS 802.100.

40 (8) The department shall maintain suitable records of driver licenses, *[and]* driver permits **and**
41 **identification cards**. The records required under this subsection shall include all of the following:

42 (a) An index by name and number.

43 *[(b) Supporting documentation of all licenses or driver permits issued.]*

44 *[(c)]* (b) Every application for a driver license, *[or]* driver permit **or identification card**.

45 *[(d)]* (c) All **driver** licenses or driver permits that have been suspended or revoked.

1 **(d) The Social Security number of the person to whom the driver license, driver permit**
 2 **or identification card is issued or an identifying number issued by the United States De-**
 3 **partment of Homeland Security.**

4 (e) For each commercial driver license, the Social Security number of the person to whom the
 5 license is issued, or any other number or identifying information that the Secretary of the United
 6 States Department of Transportation determines appropriate to identify the person.

7 (9) The Department **of Transportation** shall maintain a two-part driving record consisting of
 8 an employment driving record and a nonemployment driving record for each person as required un-
 9 der this subsection. All of the following apply to the records required under this subsection:

10 (a) The department shall maintain driving records on:

11 (A) Every person who is granted driving privileges under a driver license, driver permit or a
 12 statutory grant of driving privileges under ORS 807.020;

13 (B) Every person whose driving privileges have been suspended, revoked or canceled under this
 14 vehicle code;

15 (C) Every person who has filed an accident report under ORS 811.725 or 811.730; and

16 (D) Every person who is required to provide future responsibility filings under ORS 806.200,
 17 806.220, 806.230 or 806.240.

18 (b) In addition to other information required by this paragraph, the employment driving record
 19 shall include all reports of drug test results that are made to the department under ORS 825.410.
 20 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, release of the portion of the employment driving record
 21 that shows drug test results reported under ORS 825.410 is permitted only in accordance with ORS
 22 802.202. The employment driving record shall also include all motor vehicle accidents that the per-
 23 son is required to report under ORS 811.720, all suspensions of driving privileges required to be
 24 placed on the record under ORS 809.280, all suspensions of the person's commercial driver license
 25 that result from operation or use of a commercial motor vehicle and all convictions of the person
 26 for violation of motor vehicle laws except convictions for offenses requiring mandatory revocation
 27 or suspension of driving privileges under ORS 809.409, 809.411, 809.413 and 813.400, but shall include
 28 only such accidents, suspensions and convictions that occur while the person is driving a motor
 29 vehicle:

30 (A) In the course of the person's employment when the person is employed by another for the
 31 principal purpose of driving a motor vehicle;

32 (B) Carrying persons or property for compensation;

33 (C) In the course of the person's employment in the collection, transportation or delivery of mail
 34 if the vehicle is government owned or marked for the collection, transportation or delivery of mail
 35 in accordance with government rules;

36 (D) That is an authorized emergency vehicle;

37 (E) That is a commercial motor vehicle; or

38 (F) In the course of the person's employment with a federal, state or local government in a
 39 public works project involving repair or maintenance of water, sewer or road systems.

40 (c) The nonemployment driving record shall include the person's:

41 (A) Motor vehicle accidents that the person is required to report under ORS 811.720, other than
 42 the motor vehicle accidents that are included on the person's employment driving record;

43 (B) Suspensions, cancellations and revocations of licenses, permits and driving privileges;

44 (C) Convictions for violation of the motor vehicle laws other than those included in the em-
 45 ployment driving record including, for each violation of ORS 811.100 or 811.111, the speed at which

1 the person was convicted of traveling and the posted speed, the speed limit or the speed that con-
 2 stitutes prima facie evidence of violation of the basic speed rule, as appropriate; and

3 (D) Diversion agreements entered into under ORS 813.220 within the preceding 10 years.

4 (d) The department may record other entries to indicate correspondence, interviews, partic-
 5 ipation in driver improvement programs or other matters concerning the status of the driving priv-
 6 ileges of the person.

7 (e) When a person from another jurisdiction applies for a driver license or **driver** permit issued
 8 by this state, the department shall request a copy of the person's driving record from the other ju-
 9 risdiction. At the time the person is issued a license in Oregon, the record from the other jurisdic-
 10 tion shall become part of the driver's record in this state with the same force and effect as though
 11 entered on the driver's record in this state in the original instance. The department by rule may
 12 specify methods for converting entries from out-of-state records for use in Oregon.

13 (f) When a suspension of a driver permit, driver license or other driving privilege is placed on
 14 the driving record under ORS 809.280 for failure to appear in court on a traffic crime, the depart-
 15 ment shall note on the record that the suspension was for failure to appear in court and shall also
 16 note the offense charged against the person on which the person failed to appear.

17 (g) The department, in consultation with the Department of State Police, shall devise and im-
 18 plement a method of noting suspensions and revocations of driving privileges on the record in such
 19 a way that police agencies can determine directly from the record what class of offense, as provided
 20 by law, is committed by a person who drives in violation of the suspension or revocation. If the
 21 Department **of Transportation** and the Department of State Police devise a mutually agreeable al-
 22 ternative method of informing police agencies of the nature of a suspension or revocation and the
 23 consequences of its violation, the implementation of that method shall satisfy the duty of the De-
 24 partment **of Transportation** under this paragraph.

25 (10) The department [*of Transportation*] shall maintain records of judgments or convictions sent
 26 to the department under ORS 810.375.

27 (11) The department shall maintain accident reports filed with the department under ORS
 28 810.460 and 811.725 to 811.735.

29 (12) The department shall maintain records of bank checks or money orders returned under ORS
 30 802.110.

31 (13) The department shall maintain records of trip permits issued by the department under ORS
 32 803.600, as provided under this subsection. The records required by this subsection shall include the
 33 following:

34 (a) A description of the vehicle sufficient to identify the vehicle.

35 (b) The person to whom the permit was issued.

36 (c) When the permit was issued.

37 (d) The type of permit issued.

38 (e) For registration weight trip permits, the maximum allowable registration weight permitted
 39 for operation under the permit.

40 (f) Any other information the department determines appropriate or convenient.

41 **(14) The department shall maintain records of identity source documents, as described**
 42 **in section 22 of this 2007 Act.**

43 **SECTION 6.** ORS 807.024 is amended to read:

44 807.024. (1) A person who applies for issuance, renewal or replacement of a driver license, driver
 45 permit or identification card shall submit to collection of biometric data by the Department of

1 Transportation for the purpose of establishing the person's identity. Submitting to collection of
 2 biometric data under this section does not excuse a person from responsibility for complying with
 3 requirements for proof of identity, [*age or*] **date of birth or address** [*residence*] pursuant to ORS
 4 [807.050] **807.040 or proof of legal presence under section 2 of this 2007 Act.**

5 (2) For purposes of this section, a person's identity is established if:

6 (a) The department finds that the biometric data collected as required under subsection (1) of
 7 this section match the biometric data that are already in the department's records for that person;
 8 or

9 (b) The department finds that the biometric data collected as required under subsection (1) of
 10 this section do not match biometric data in the department's records for any other person and the
 11 department does not otherwise have reason to believe that the person is not who the person claims
 12 to be.

13 (3) If a person's identity is established as described in subsection (2) of this section, the de-
 14 partment shall mail the driver license, driver permit or identification card to the address provided
 15 by the person when the person applied for the issuance, renewal or replacement of the license,
 16 permit or identification card.

17 (4) If a person's identity is not established as described in subsection (2) of this section, the
 18 department shall:

19 (a) Inform the person who submitted to collection of biometric data that the person's identity
 20 was not established; and

21 (b) Provide the person with the opportunity to establish the person's identity by an alternative
 22 method approved by the department by rule.

23 (5) If a person's identity was not established as described in subsection (2) of this section and
 24 the department has reason to believe that the crime of identity theft, as described in ORS 165.800,
 25 was committed by the person currently submitting to collection of biometric data or by a person
 26 who previously submitted to collection of biometric data under the identity of the person currently
 27 submitting to collection of biometric data, the department shall notify a law enforcement agency
 28 that has jurisdiction over the crime.

29 (6) The department by rule shall establish procedures for providing expedited processing of
 30 driver licenses, driver permits or identification cards.

31 (7) The department and employees of the department are immune from liability for any damages
 32 resulting from the issuance, renewal or replacement of a driver license, driver permit or identifica-
 33 tion card under another person's identity if the employee who processed the biometric data for a
 34 license, permit or identification card established the applicant's identity as described in subsection
 35 (2) of this section.

36 **SECTION 7.** ORS 807.040 is amended to read:

37 807.040. (1) The Department of Transportation shall issue a driver license to any person who
 38 complies with all of the following requirements:

39 (a) The person must complete an application for a license under ORS 807.050.

40 (b) **The person must present proof of legal presence and a Social Security number or an**
 41 **identifying number issued by the United States Department of Homeland Security, as re-**
 42 **quired by section 2 of this 2007 Act.**

43 (c) **The person must present acceptable documents to prove identity, date of birth and**
 44 **address. The Department of Transportation shall determine by rule what documents are ac-**
 45 **ceptable to prove identity, date of birth and address.**

1 [(b)] (d) The person must not be ineligible for the license under ORS 807.060 and must be eligible
2 for the license under ORS 807.062.

3 [(c)] (e) The person must successfully pass all examination requirements under ORS 807.070 for
4 the class of license sought.

5 [(d)] (f) The appropriate license fee under ORS 807.370 for the class of license sought must be
6 paid.

7 [(e)] (g) The Student Driver Training Fund eligibility fee must be paid.

8 [(f)] (h) If the application is for a commercial driver license, the person must be the holder of
9 a Class C license or any higher class of license.

10 [(g)] (i) If the application is for a commercial driver license, the person must submit to the de-
11 partment, in a form approved by the department, the report of a medical examination that estab-
12 lishes, to the satisfaction of the department, that the person meets the medical requirements for the
13 particular class of license. The department, by rule, shall establish medical requirements for pur-
14 poses of this paragraph. The medical requirements established under this paragraph may include any
15 requirements the department determines are necessary for the safe operation of vehicles permitted
16 to be operated under the class of license for which the requirements are established.

17 [(h)] (j) If the application is for a commercial driver license, the person must:

18 (A) Have at least one year's driving experience;

19 (B) Not be disqualified from holding a commercial driver license under ORS 809.404; and

20 (C) Not be otherwise ineligible to hold a commercial driver license.

21 (2) The department shall work with other agencies and organizations to attempt to improve the
22 issuance system for driver licenses.

23 **SECTION 8.** ORS 807.040, as amended by section 6, chapter 775, Oregon Laws 2005, is amended
24 to read:

25 807.040. (1) The Department of Transportation shall issue a driver license to any person who
26 complies with all of the following requirements:

27 (a) The person must complete an application for a license under ORS 807.050.

28 **(b) The person must present proof of legal presence and a Social Security number or an**
29 **identifying number issued by the United States Department of Homeland Security, as re-**
30 **quired by section 2 of this 2007 Act.**

31 **(c) The person must present acceptable documents to prove identity, date of birth and**
32 **address. The Department of Transportation shall determine by rule what documents are ac-**
33 **ceptable to prove identity, date of birth and address.**

34 [(b)] (d) The person must submit to collection of biometric data by the department that establish
35 the identity of the person as described in ORS 807.024.

36 [(c)] (e) The person must not be ineligible for the license under ORS 807.060 and must be eligible
37 for the license under ORS 807.062.

38 [(d)] (f) The person must successfully pass all examination requirements under ORS 807.070 for
39 the class of license sought.

40 [(e)] (g) The person must pay the appropriate license fee under ORS 807.370 for the class of li-
41 cense sought.

42 [(f)] (h) The person must pay the Student Driver Training Fund eligibility fee.

43 [(g)] (i) If the application is for a commercial driver license, the person must be the holder of
44 a Class C license or any higher class of license.

45 [(h)] (j) If the application is for a commercial driver license, the person must submit to the de-

1 partment, in a form approved by the department, the report of a medical examination that estab-
 2 lishes that the person meets the medical requirements for the particular class of license. The
 3 department, by rule, shall establish medical requirements for purposes of this paragraph. The med-
 4 ical requirements established under this paragraph may include any requirements the department
 5 determines are necessary for the safe operation of vehicles permitted to be operated under the class
 6 of license for which the requirements are established.

7 [(i)] **(k)** If the application is for a commercial driver license, the person must:

8 (A) Have at least one year's driving experience;

9 (B) Not be disqualified from holding a commercial driver license under ORS 809.404; and

10 (C) Not be otherwise ineligible to hold a commercial driver license.

11 (2) The department shall work with other agencies and organizations to attempt to improve the
 12 issuance system for driver licenses.

13 **SECTION 9.** ORS 807.050 is amended to read:

14 807.050. An application for a **driver** license shall be in a form approved by the [*Oregon*] De-
 15 partment of Transportation. An application must contain all the following:

16 (1) The applicant's [*true*] name, [*age*] **date of birth**, [*sex*] **gender**, [*residence*] address, except as
 17 otherwise provided for corrections officers in ORS 802.253 or eligible employees in ORS 802.250, and
 18 post-office address other than general delivery. **Name, date of birth and address shall be defined
 19 by the department by rule.** The department may provide by rule for acceptance of something other
 20 than an actual residence or post-office address if the department determines that the applicant does
 21 not have an actual address. The department shall require proof to verify the address in addition to
 22 anything else the department may require of the applicant.

23 (2) Whether or not the applicant has ever been issued any driver license or driver permit. If the
 24 applicant has been issued any **driver** license or driver permit:

25 (a) When the **driver** license or driver permit was granted;

26 (b) What jurisdiction granted the **driver** license or driver permit;

27 (c) Whether or not the driving privileges under the **driver** license or driver permit are currently
 28 suspended or revoked; and

29 (d) If the driving privileges are revoked or suspended, the date and reason for the suspension
 30 or revocation.

31 (3) The class of license sought.

32 [(4) *The Social Security number of the applicant or other number or identifying information deter-*
 33 *mined appropriate by the Secretary of the United States Department of Transportation, if the applica-*
 34 *tion is for a commercial driver license or if the Oregon Department of Transportation by rule requires*
 35 *the Social Security number on the application.*]

36 **(4) The Social Security number of the applicant or, if the applicant is not eligible for a
 37 Social Security number, an identifying number issued by the United States Department of
 38 Homeland Security.**

39 **(5) For each commercial driver license, the applicant's Social Security number or identi-
 40 fying number issued by the United States Department of Homeland Security, or any other
