HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO RESOLVE CONFLICTS TO B-ENGROSSED SENATE BILL 456

1	On page 1 of the printed B-engrossed bill, line 2, after "officials;" insert "creating new pro-
2	visions;" and after "292.425" insert "and section 10, chapter, Oregon Laws 2007 (Enrolled Senate
3	Bill 700); repealing section 8, chapter, Oregon Laws 2007 (Enrolled Senate Bill 700)".
4	On page 3, after line 3, insert:
5	"SECTION 5a. If Senate Bill 994 becomes law, sections 1 (amending ORS 292.405), 2
6	(amending ORS 292.410), 3 (amending ORS 292.415) and 4 (amending ORS 292.425) of this 2007
7	Act are repealed.
8	"SECTION 5b. If Senate Bill 700 becomes law, section 8, chapter, Oregon Laws 2007
9	(Enrolled Senate Bill 700) (amending ORS 171.072), is repealed and ORS 171.072, as amended
10	by section 5 of this 2007 Act, is amended to read:
11	"171.072. (1) A member of the Legislative Assembly shall receive for services an annual salary
12	[that is equal to that provided for one step below the maximum of Salary Range 1 in the Management
13	Service Compensation Plan in the executive department as defined in ORS 174.112] established as
14	provided in ORS 292.907 to 292.930.
15	"(2)(a) The President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives each shall
16	receive for services, as additional salary, an amount equal to the [sum] salary allowed each of them
17	as a member under subsection (1) of this section.
18	"(b) The Majority Leader and Minority Leader of the Senate and the Majority Leader and
19	Minority Leader of the House of Representatives each shall receive for services, as additional
20	salary, an amount determined as provided in ORS 292.907 to 292.930.
21	"(3) A member of the Legislative Assembly shall receive, as an allowance for expenses not oth-
22	erwise provided for, a per diem determined as provided in subsection (9) of this section for each day
23	within the period that the Legislative Assembly is in session, to be paid with the salary provided for
24	in subsection (1) of this section. Pursuant to procedures determined by the Legislative Adminis-
25	tration Committee, a member may draw from an accrued allowance.
26	"(4) A member of the Legislative Assembly shall receive, as an allowance for expenses incurred
27	in the performance of official duties during periods when the legislature is not in session, \$400 for
28	each calendar month or part of a calendar month during those periods, to be paid monthly, and
29	subject to approval of the President of the Senate or Speaker of the House of Representatives,
30	mileage expenses and a per diem determined as provided in subsection (9) of this section for each
31	day a member is engaged in the business of legislative interim and statutory committees, including
32	advisore committees and antermittees of advisore committees and task former and for each day
	advisory committees and subcommittees of advisory committees, and task forces and for each day
33	a member serves on interstate bodies, advisory committees and other entities on which the member

35 "(5) In addition to the mileage and per diem expense payments provided by this section, a

1 member of the Legislative Assembly may receive reimbursement for actual and necessary expenses,

subject to approval by the President of the Senate or Speaker of the House of Representatives, for
legislative business outside of the state.

- 4 "(6) The President of the Senate and **the** Speaker of the House of Representatives may delegate 5 to the chairpersons of interim and statutory committees and task forces the approval authority 6 granted to [*them*] **the President and the Speaker** by subsection (4) of this section, with respect to 7 expenses incurred in attending any meeting of a particular committee or task force.
- 8 "(7) Amounts received under subsections (3) to (5) of this section are excluded from gross income 9 and expenditures of the amounts are excluded in computing deductions for purposes of ORS chapter 10 316. If there is attached to the personal income return a schedule of all ordinary and necessary 11 business expenses paid during the tax year as a member of the Legislative Assembly, a deduction 12may be claimed on the return for legislative expenses paid in excess of the amounts received under 13subsections (3) to (5) of this section. Expenses of members of the Legislative Assembly [that] who 14 are reimbursed by the state for actual expenses for meals and lodging associated with state travel 15 for the same period during which a legislator receives per diem [is] are subject to state income tax. 16 "(8) For periods when the Legislative Assembly is not in session, the Legislative Administration
- 17 Committee shall provide for a telephone and an expense allowance for members of the Legislative 18 Assembly that is in addition to the amount allowed under subsection (4) of this section. In deter-19 mining the amount of allowance for members, the committee shall consider the geographic area of 20 the member's district. The additional allowance shall reflect travel expenses necessary to communi-21 cate in districts of varying sizes.
- "(9) The per diem allowance referred to in subsections (3) and (4) of this section shall be the amount fixed for per diem allowance that is authorized by the United States Internal Revenue Service to be excluded from gross income without itemization.
- 25 "<u>SECTION 5c.</u> If Senate Bill 700 becomes law, section 10, chapter ____, Oregon Laws 2007 (En 26 rolled Senate Bill 700), is amended to read:
- "Sec. 10. The [amendments to ORS 171.072 by section 8 of this 2007 Act and the] repeal of statutes by section 11 [of this 2007 Act], chapter ___, Oregon Laws 2007 (Enrolled Senate Bill 700), become operative on July 1, 2009.
- 30 "<u>SECTION 5d.</u> The amendments to ORS 171.072 by section 5b of this 2007 Act become 31 operative on July 1, 2009.".

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
