| 8 | "(2) A consumer may revoke a provision in a consumer contract that requires the con- |
| 9 | sumer to assert a claim against the other party to the contract, or respond to a claim by the |
| 10 | other party to the contract, in a forum that is not in this state. If the provision requires |
| 11 | arbitration in a forum that is not in this state, the sole effect of a revocation under this |
| 12 | section is that any evidentiary hearing, oral argument or other proceeding that requires or |
| 13 | allows attendance by the consumer must be conducted in this state. |
| 14 | "(3) Revocation of a provision under this section must be made in writing and commu- |
| 15 | nicated by the consumer to the other party within a reasonable time after a dispute arises. |
| 16 | "(4) This section applies only to a consumer contract that was entered into by a con- |
| 17 | sumer when the consumer was a resident of this state. |
| 18 | "(5) A party seeking to enforce a revoked provision is liable for reasonable attorney fees |
| 19 | incurred by a consumer in any litigation that results from the attempted enforcement of the |
| 20 | revoked provision.". |
