SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

[Directs Office of Emergency Management to develop and operate statewide first responder building mapping information system.]

Directs Office of Emergency Management to create Critical Infrastructure Information System for first responder emergency response purposes and to map at least 30 high schools by January 1, 2009.

Creates Critical Infrastructure Information System Advisory Committee. Specifies membership and duties of committee.

Appropriates moneys to Office of Emergency Management for payment of costs to implement system.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

2 Relating to first responder building mapping information systems; appropriating money; and declar-

4 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

5 **SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2007 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 401.260 to**
6 **401.325.**

7 **SECTION 2. (1) As used in this section, "first responder" means an individual who, as a**
8 **regular function of the individual's employment or in a voluntary capacity as an emergency**
9 **service worker, provides initial response to the scene of an emergency.**

10 **(2) The Office of Emergency Management shall create the Critical Infrastructure Infor-**
11 **mation System to establish and maintain a database or other information resources neces-**
12 **sary and appropriate for effective first responder emergency response.**

13 **(3) The office shall map at least 30 high schools by January 1, 2009.**

14 **SECTION 3. (1) There is created the Critical Infrastructure Information System Advisory**
15 **Committee, consisting of nine members who have expertise in emergency response and who**
16 **are appointed as follows:**

17 **(a) The President of the Senate shall appoint three members.**

18 **(b) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint three members.**

19 **(c) The Governor shall appoint three members.**

20 **(2) The committee, in cooperation with the Governor's Oregon Geographic Information**
21 **Council, shall:**

22 **(a) Research and determine what state, local and tribal resources are available for first**
23 **responder building mapping;**

1 (b) Research and determine the products that are available to facilitate the task of
2 building mapping and recommend an information technology plan to support secure mainte-
3 nance of a database or other information resources with appropriate access for first
4 responders;

5 (c) Research and determine appropriate standards for coordinated emergency response
6 tools and methods for interface with local first responders; and

7 (d) Recommend a process to develop a coordinated first responder building mapping sys-
8 tem in Oregon.

9 (3) A majority of the members of the committee constitutes a quorum for the transaction
10 of business.

11 (4) Official action by the committee requires the approval of a majority of the members
12 of the committee.

13 (5) The committee shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson.

14 (6) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority shall make an appoint-
15 ment to become immediately effective.

16 (7) The committee shall meet at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson
17 or of a majority of the members of the committee.

18 (8) The committee may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the committee.

19 (9) The committee shall submit a report, and may include recommendations for legis-
20 lation, to an interim committee related to emergency response as appropriate no later than
21 October 1, 2009.

22 (10) The Office of Emergency Management shall provide staff support to the committee.

23 (11) Members of the committee are not entitled to compensation, but may be reimbursed
24 for actual and necessary travel and other expenses incurred by them in the performance of
25 their official duties in the manner and amounts provided for in ORS 292.495. Claims for ex-
26 penses shall be paid out of funds appropriated to the office for that purpose.

27 (12) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist
28 the committee in the performance of its duties and, to the extent permitted by laws relating
29 to confidentiality, to furnish information and advice as the members of the committee con-
30 sider necessary to perform their duties.

31 **SECTION 4.** Section 3 of this 2007 Act is repealed on the date of the convening of the next
32 regular biennial legislative session.

33 **SECTION 5.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropri-
34 ated to the Office of Emergency Management for the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, out
35 of the General Fund, the amount of \$_____ for payment of costs to implement sections 2
36 and 3 of this 2007 Act, including the costs of one full-time equivalent (FTE) employee to staff
37 the Critical Infrastructure Information System and the Critical Infrastructure Information
38 System Advisory Committee.

39 **SECTION 6.** This 2007 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
40 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2007 Act takes effect
41 on its passage.

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
