SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Renames Oregon State Boxing and Wrestling Commission as Oregon State Athletic Commission. Provides for regulation of mixed martial arts. Modifies authority of Superintendent of State Police to regulate boxing and entertainment wrestling. Prohibits issuance of license to persons under 18 years of age to act as [*professional boxer or*] mixed martial arts competitor. Establishes Oregon State Athletic Commission Medical Advisory Committee. Requires commission to assign medical personnel to boxing and mixed martial arts events.

Provides that certain ordinances adopted by city or county before February 1, 2007, that regulate boxing or mixed martial arts may not be enforced after Superintendent of State Police adopts rules for conducting professional boxing and mixed martial arts events that promote safety and best interest of contestants and public.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

6 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

7 **SECTION 1.** ORS 463.015 is amended to read:

8 463.015. As used in this chapter:

9 (1) "Boxing" means a contest [*other than as described in subsection (7) of this section*] between
10 contestants who fight with their fists protected by gloves or mittens fashioned of leather or similar
11 material, the duration of which is limited to a stated number of rounds separated by rest periods
12 of equal duration[, *and*]. "**Boxing**" includes kickboxing, a form of boxing in which blows are deliv-
13 ered with any part of the arm below the shoulder, including the hand, and any part of the leg below
14 the hip, including the foot.

15 [(2) "*Cable system operator*" means a person or group of persons who:]

16 [(a) *Provides cable service over a cable system and directly or through one or more affiliates owns*
17 *a significant interest in the cable system; or*]

18 [(b) *Controls or is responsible for, through an arrangement, the management and operation of the*
19 *cable system.*]

20 [(3) "*Commission*" means the Oregon State Boxing and Wrestling Commission.]

21 [(4) "*Department*" means the Department of State Police.]

22 [(5)] (2) "Entertainment wrestling" means a **noncompetitive** performance in which the partic-

1 ipants deliver blows or apply holds with no intent to punish or immobilize an opponent. Enter-
 2 tainment wrestling is distinguished from boxing, [*extreme fighting and*] **mixed martial arts or other**
 3 wrestling by the fact that the outcome of the performance is predetermined.

4 **(3) “Event” means a boxing, mixed martial arts or entertainment wrestling match, con-**
 5 **test, exhibition or performance.**

6 [(6)] **(4) “Exhibition” means a demonstration of boxing or [*wrestling skills*] mixed martial arts**
 7 **skills, the results of which are not counted towards the official record of the competitors.**

8 [(7) “*Extreme fighting*” means a no-holds-barred match, competition or exhibition that combines el-
 9 ements of boxing, wrestling or martial arts without a system of rules approved by the Oregon State
 10 Boxing and Wrestling Commission.]

11 [(8)] **(5) “Judge” means a person licensed by the Superintendent of State Police who is at**
 12 **ringside during a boxing or [*wrestling*] mixed martial arts [*match*] event and who has the respon-**
 13 **sibility of scoring the performance of the participants in the [*match*] event.**

14 [(9)] **(6) “Manager” means a person licensed by the superintendent who does any of the follow-**
 15 **ing:**

16 (a) By contract or agreement undertakes to represent the interests of any professional boxer or
 17 [*wrestler*] **mixed martial arts competitor** in procuring or arranging the conduct of any [*profes-*
 18 *sional*] boxing or [*wrestling match*] **mixed martial arts event** in which the **professional** boxer or
 19 [*wrestler*] **mixed martial arts competitor** is a participant [*as a contestant*].

20 (b) Receives or is entitled to receive more than 10 percent of the **contracted portion of the**
 21 **gross purse** of any professional boxer or [*wrestler*] **mixed martial arts competitor** for any services
 22 related to [*such*] **the boxer’s** or [*wrestler’s*] **mixed martial arts competitor’s** participation in a
 23 [*professional*] boxing **or mixed martial arts [*contest*] event.**

24 (c) Is an officer, director or stockholder of any corporation which receives or is entitled to re-
 25 ceive more than 10 percent of the **contracted portion of the** gross purse of any professional boxer
 26 or [*wrestler*] **mixed martial arts competitor** for any services relating to [*such*] **the boxer’s** or
 27 [*wrestler’s*] **mixed martial arts competitor’s** participation in a [*professional*] boxing or [*wrestling*]
 28 **mixed martial arts [*contest*] event.**

29 (d) Directs or controls the professional [*boxing*] activities of any professional boxer or
 30 [*wrestler*] **mixed martial arts competitor.**

31 (e) Attends the professional boxer or [*wrestler*] **mixed martial arts competitor** at ringside or
 32 purports to be the [*professional boxer’s or wrestler’s manager*] **manager of a professional boxer**
 33 **or mixed martial arts competitor.**

34 [(10)] **(7) “Matchmaker” means a person licensed [*or issued a permit*] by the Superintendent of**
 35 **State Police** who is employed by or associated with a promoter in the capacity of booking and ar-
 36 ranging boxing or [*wrestling matches*] **mixed martial arts events** between opponents and for whose
 37 activities in this regard the promoter is legally responsible.

38 [(11) “*Pay-per-view*” means a closed-circuit telecast, regardless of the delivery system used, that is
 39 not intended to be available for viewing without the payment of a fee, whether collected or based on
 40 each event viewed, for the privilege of viewing the telecast.]

41 **(8) “Mixed martial arts” means a combative sporting contest, the rules of which allow**
 42 **two mixed martial arts competitors to attempt to achieve dominance over one another by**
 43 **utilizing a variety of techniques including, but not limited to, striking, grappling and the**
 44 **application of submission holds. “Mixed martial arts” does not include martial arts such as**
 45 **tae kwon do, karate, kempo karate, kenpo karate, judo, sumo, jujitsu, Brazilian jujitsu, sub-**

1 **mission wrestling and kung fu.**

2 (9) **“Official” means an individual authorized by the Oregon State Athletic Commission**
3 **to perform duties as assigned by the commission. “Official” includes, but is not limited to,**
4 **a referee, judge, timekeeper, inspector or ringside physician or other assigned medical per-**
5 **sonnel.**

6 [(12)] (10) “Person” includes an individual, association, partnership or corporation.

7 [(13)] (11) “Professional boxer or [wrestler] **mixed martial arts competitor**” means [a person]
8 **an individual** licensed by the superintendent who competes for **or has competed for** a money prize,
9 purse or compensation in a boxing **event** or [wrestling contest, exhibition or match held within this
10 state.] **has competed in a professional or amateur mixed martial arts event.**

11 [(14)] (12) “Promoter” means a corporation, partnership, association, individual or other organ-
12 ization licensed by the superintendent who arranges, gives, holds or conducts a boxing [or wrestling
13 contest, match or exhibition], **mixed martial arts** or [an] entertainment wrestling [performance]
14 **event** in this state and who is legally responsible for the lawful conduct of [such] **the** boxing [or
15 wrestling contest, match or exhibition], **mixed martial arts** or entertainment wrestling
16 [performance] **event.** [“Promoter” includes:]

17 [(a) A person who holds distribution rights to a closed-circuit telecast of a boxing or wrestling
18 event that occurs within or outside this state and who sells the rights to a cable system operator in this
19 state.]

20 [(b) A person who holds the distribution rights to a pay-per-view telecast of a boxing or wrestling
21 event that occurs within or outside this state and who sells the ability to receive the telecast to a person
22 who charges an admission for the right to view the telecast in this state.]

23 [(c) A person who holds distribution rights to a closed-circuit telecast of a boxing or wrestling
24 event that occurs within this state and who sells the rights to another for broadcast within or outside
25 this state. “Promoter” does not include a cable system operator.]

26 [(15) “Superintendent” means the Superintendent of State Police.]

27 [(16) “Wrestling” includes any form of fighting other than as described in subsections (1), (5) and
28 (7) of this section, between contestants in which the contestants deliver blows to an opponent’s body or
29 apply holds to the opponent’s body with the intent to punish, immobilize or throw the opponent, with
30 the possible effect of rendering the opponent unable to continue the contest.]

31 **SECTION 2.** ORS 463.018 is amended to read:

32 463.018. [(1)] The Legislative Assembly finds that the boxing [and wrestling industry], **mixed**
33 **martial arts and entertainment wrestling industries** in this state should be regulated in order
34 to protect the best interests of both contestants and the public.

35 [(2) The Legislative Assembly further finds that:]

36 [(a) The entertainment spectacle commonly known as extreme fighting is a violent exhibition that
37 is excessively and unacceptably dangerous to the participants and is promoted and advertised to that
38 end;]

39 [(b) Extreme fighting lacks appropriate restrictions on dangerous blows or life-threatening maneu-
40 vers, and the matching of participants with incompatible styles of fighting makes it impossible for the
41 state to regulate extreme fighting in a way that can reasonably protect the safety of the participants;
42 and]

43 [(c) It is therefore an appropriate exercise of the authority of the State of Oregon to prohibit ex-
44 treme fighting and similarly named combative sports.]

45 **SECTION 3.** ORS 463.025 is amended to read:

1 463.025. (1) [No] A person [shall] **may not** act as a professional boxer or [wrestler] **mixed**
2 **martial arts competitor**, manager of a professional boxer or [wrestler] **mixed martial arts com-**
3 **petitor**, referee, judge, second, timekeeper[, matchmaker, ticket taker, security officer or box office
4 **employee] or matchmaker** until the person has been licensed pursuant to this chapter.

5 [(2) The person employing a matchmaker, ticket taker, security officer or box office employee may
6 apply for a permit covering all such employees in lieu of their obtaining individual licenses. However,
7 the same standards apply to such employees operating under a permit as would apply if the employees
8 were licensed.]

9 [(3)] (2) [The] Application for a license [or permit] shall be made upon a form furnished by the
10 Superintendent of State Police and shall be accompanied by an annual license [or permit] fee [as
11 determined] **established** by the superintendent **by rule**.

12 [(4)] (3) Each person licensed [or issued a permit] under this section [shall keep the license or
13 copy of the permit in the person's personal possession and] shall present the license [or copy of the
14 permit] upon request to promoters and representatives of the superintendent, including members of
15 the Oregon State [Boxing and Wrestling] **Athletic** Commission, as evidence of eligibility to act or
16 perform in the person's licensed [or permitted] capacities in connection with boxing or [wrestling
17 contests, matches or exhibitions] **mixed martial arts events**.

18 (4) **A person under 18 years of age may not be issued a license to act as a mixed martial**
19 **arts competitor.**

20 **SECTION 4.** ORS 463.035 is amended to read:

21 463.035. (1) [No] A person [shall] **may not** act as a promoter of boxing, [wrestling] **mixed**
22 **martial arts** or entertainment wrestling until the person has been licensed pursuant to this chapter.

23 (2) [The] Application for a promoter's license shall be made upon a form furnished by the Su-
24 perintendent of State Police and [shall] **must** be accompanied by [an annual license fee in an amount
25 to be determined] **payment of the application fee established** by the superintendent **by rule**.

26 (3) Before a license is issued to any promoter of boxing, [wrestling] **mixed martial arts** or
27 entertainment wrestling, the applicant for [such license] **licensure** must:

28 (a) **Pay the annual license fee established by the superintendent by rule; and**

29 (b) File with the superintendent a corporate surety bond issued by a company authorized to do
30 business in this state drawn in an amount acceptable to the superintendent and **the release of**
31 **which is** conditioned upon [the occurrence of the following]:

32 [(a)] (A) Timely payment of all taxes and civil penalties due the state or its political
33 subdivisions[.];

34 [(b)] (B) Payment to the state or a political subdivision thereof which establishes liability
35 against a promoter for damages, penalties or expenses arising from promotional activity[.];

36 [(c)] (C) Payment of the purses of the competitors[.];

37 [(d)] (D) Payment of reimbursement to the superintendent of the cost of approval of an event
38 canceled by the promoter without good cause[.]; **and**

39 [(e)] (E) Payment of compensation to inspectors, referees, timekeepers, judges and event [physi-
40 cians] **medical personnel**.

41 (4) **In addition to the requirements specified in subsection (3) of this section, prior to**
42 **being issued a license to promote entertainment wrestling, an applicant must provide an af-**
43 **fidavit to the superintendent stating that the health and safety of the participants is the**
44 **responsibility of the promoter.**

45 [(4)] (5) If the circumstances of an event to be promoted so require, the superintendent may in-

1 crease the [face] **required** amount of the corporate surety bond previously filed with the super-
2 intendent in compliance with this section.

3 [(5)] **(6)** The superintendent may accept a cash deposit or the assignment of a savings account
4 in lieu of the corporate surety bond required by this section.

5 [(6) *The following persons must possess a promoter's license issued pursuant to this chapter:*]

6 [(a) *A person who holds distribution rights to a closed-circuit telecast of a boxing or wrestling*
7 *event that occurs within or outside this state and who sells the rights to a cable system operator in this*
8 *state.*]

9 [(b) *A person who holds the distribution rights to a pay-per-view telecast of a boxing or wrestling*
10 *event that occurs within or outside this state and who sells the ability to receive the telecast to a person*
11 *who charges an admission for the right to view the telecast in this state.*]

12 [(c) *A person who holds distribution rights to a closed-circuit telecast of a boxing or wrestling*
13 *event that occurs within this state and who sells the rights to another for broadcast within or outside*
14 *this state.*]

15 **SECTION 5.** ORS 463.037 is amended to read:

16 463.037. [No] **A** boxing match [shall] **may not** take place in this state unless the following
17 Oregon State [Boxing and Wrestling] **Athletic** Commission representatives are in attendance:

18 (1) One commissioner or designated representative to oversee conduct of the match;

19 (2) [Licensed judges and referees;] **Officials assigned by the commission; and**

20 (3) [A licensed physician designated] **Medical personnel assigned** by the commission. [; and]

21 [(4) *An inspector appointed by the commission.*]

22 **SECTION 6.** ORS 463.113 is amended to read:

23 463.113. (1) There is created in the Department of State Police the Oregon State [Boxing and
24 Wrestling] **Athletic** Commission, which shall regulate the promotion of all professional boxing [and
25 wrestling], **mixed martial arts** [matches and exhibitions] and entertainment wrestling [performances
26 within the boundaries of the State of Oregon] **events in this state**. The commission shall [recommend,
27 and the Superintendent of State Police shall adopt without change,] **adopt** rules for [the conduct of]
28 **conducting** professional boxing and [wrestling] **mixed martial arts events** that promote the safety
29 and best interest of the contestants and of the public.

30 (2) The Superintendent [has the following powers] **of State Police shall:**

31 (a) [To] **Adopt and** enforce rules for [the conduct of] **conducting** professional boxing and [wres-
32 tling] **mixed martial arts events** that promote the safety and best interest of the contestants and
33 of the public.

34 (b) [To] License and regulate participants and officials for all professional boxing and [wrestling
35 matches and exhibitions] **professional and amateur mixed martial arts events** in this state.

36 (c) [To] Establish and utilize the most efficient methods available for compiling boxing **and**
37 **mixed martial arts event** results and record keeping and for communication of results and records.

38 (d) **Make available** upon request[, to make] **the records of every participant in and the** re-
39 sults of every boxing and [wrestling event within its jurisdiction, and records of any contestant who
40 participates in events within its jurisdiction, available to state agencies of another state charged with
41 regulatory authority over boxing and wrestling events in that state, to record keeping organizations and
42 to other interested persons and to receive and give effect to the regulatory orders of any agency of an-
43 other state charged with regulatory authority over boxing and wrestling events in that state] **mixed**
44 **martial arts event subject to regulation under this chapter.**

45 (e) The provisions of this subsection do not apply to entertainment wrestling.

1 (3)(a) **If, in the judgment of the superintendent, it is necessary to protect the public in-**
 2 **terest or the health or safety of boxing, mixed martial arts or entertainment wrestling par-**
 3 **ticipants,** the superintendent may temporarily suspend, without prior notice or hearing, any license
 4 issued pursuant to this chapter until **a final determination is made** by the superintendent[, *if, in the*
 5 *judgment of the superintendent, the action is necessary to protect the public interest or the health or*
 6 *safety of boxing and wrestling participants*]. If no hearing is held prior to the suspension, the sus-
 7 pended licensee may apply to the superintendent for a hearing to determine if the suspension should
 8 be modified, set aside or continued. The application for a hearing shall be in writing and must be
 9 received by the superintendent within 30 days [after] **of** the date of suspension. The superintendent
 10 shall set the matter for hearing within 30 days [after] **of** receipt of the written request of the sus-
 11 pended licensee.

12 [(b) *Notwithstanding the grounds for suspension of a license under paragraph (a) of this sub-*
 13 *section, the license of a promoter of an entertainment wrestling performance may be suspended only if*
 14 *the licensee fails to provide to the superintendent, at least 10 days prior to the performance, an affidavit*
 15 *that certifies that all participants who are going to participate in the entertainment wrestling perform-*
 16 *ance are free from blood borne pathogens.*]

17 (4) Whenever any promoter fails to make a report of any [contest or] event within the period
 18 prescribed by this chapter, or whenever [such] **a required** report is unsatisfactory, the superinten-
 19 dent or a designee of the superintendent may examine, or cause to be examined, the books and re-
 20 cords of the promoter and any other persons or organizations, and subpoena and examine under oath
 21 such persons for the purpose of determining the total amount of the gross receipts for any [contest
 22 or] event and the amount of tax due pursuant to this chapter. The superintendent may fix and de-
 23 termine the tax as a result of the examination described in this subsection.

24 (5) The superintendent may delegate to the Oregon State [Boxing and Wrestling] **Athletic**
 25 Commission any of the powers described in subsection (2) of this section.

26 **SECTION 7.** ORS 463.125 is amended to read:

27 463.125. (1) The Oregon State [Boxing and Wrestling] **Athletic** Commission shall consist of five
 28 members appointed by the Superintendent of State Police for terms of four years. [*Except as de-*
 29 *scribed in subsection (10) of this section, no member shall be eligible to*] **A member may not** serve
 30 more than two terms. Membership shall represent distinct geographic areas. The Portland metro-
 31 politan area, central Willamette Valley and two other areas shall be represented. Vacancies occur-
 32 ring shall be filled by appointment in the same manner for the balance of the unexpired term.
 33 [*Each*] **A** member of the commission may be removed from office by the superintendent for cause.
 34 Each member of the commission, before entering upon the duties of office, shall take and subscribe
 35 to an oath to perform the duties of this office faithfully, impartially and justly to the **best of the**
 36 member's ability.

37 (2) The chairperson and vice chairperson shall be elected from among the members at the first
 38 meeting of each calendar year or when a vacancy exists.

39 (3) [A full-time or part-time] **An** administrator shall be appointed by the superintendent using the
 40 State Personnel Relations Law to establish suitable qualifications and compensation. The adminis-
 41 trator shall be required to demonstrate adequate knowledge and experience related to boxing and
 42 [wrestling] **mixed martial arts.**

43 (4) The superintendent may employ other personnel as necessary.

44 [(5) *One of the appointed commissioners shall be a physician, duly licensed to practice in this*
 45 *state.*]

1 [(6)] (5) The commission may meet once a month at a time and place agreed upon. Special ad-
2 ditional meetings may be called by the administrator or at the request of one or more members of
3 the commission.

4 [(7)] (6) Three members of the commission shall constitute a quorum.

5 [(8)] (7) Three votes shall constitute a majority.

6 [(9)] (8) [*Nonsalaried*] Members of the commission and representatives of the commission shall
7 be paid per diem and travel expenses as designated under ORS 292.495 when conducting the business
8 of the commission.

9 [(10) *Notwithstanding subsection (1) of this section, with the approval of the superintendent, a*
10 *physician member of the commission may serve more than two consecutive terms as a commission*
11 *member.*]

12 **SECTION 8. Sections 9 and 11 of this 2007 Act are added to and made a part of ORS**
13 **chapter 463.**

14 **SECTION 9. (1) There is established an Oregon State Athletic Commission Medical Ad-**
15 **visory Committee consisting of five members appointed by the Superintendent of State Po-**
16 **lice. Members of the committee shall be physicians licensed under ORS chapter 677.**

17 **(2) The term of office of each committee member is four years, but committee members**
18 **serve at the pleasure of the superintendent. A committee member may not serve more than**
19 **two consecutive terms, except that a committee member serves until a successor is ap-**
20 **pointed and qualified. If there is a vacancy for any cause, the superintendent shall make an**
21 **appointment to become immediately effective for the unexpired term.**

22 **(3) A committee member is entitled to the same compensation and expenses provided for**
23 **members of the Oregon State Athletic Commission under ORS 463.125.**

24 **(4) A majority of the members of the committee constitutes a quorum for the transaction**
25 **of business.**

26 **(5) The committee shall gather, assess and update, when necessary, medical data for the**
27 **purpose of recommending to the commission:**

28 **(a) Fitness criteria for contestants to be applied in prefight medical examinations;**

29 **(b) Medical procedures and substances allowed for use by seconds in a contestant's cor-**
30 **ner;**

31 **(c) Emergency procedures for ring injuries;**

32 **(d) Post-fight examination and treatment procedures; and**

33 **(e) Safety equipment required to promote the best interests of the contestants.**

34 **(6) The committee shall periodically present to the commission the proposed safety and**
35 **medical procedures developed under subsection (5) of this section for discussion and consid-**
36 **eration for adoption.**

37 **(7) The committee shall identify and nominate for approval by the commission a suffi-**
38 **cient number of qualified licensed physicians to serve as ringside physicians for boxing and**
39 **mixed martial arts events held throughout this state.**

40 **(8) A member of the committee who has been nominated by the committee and approved**
41 **by the commission may serve as a ringside physician.**

42 **SECTION 10. Notwithstanding the term of office specified under section 9 of this 2007**
43 **Act, of the members first appointed to the Oregon State Athletic Commission Medical Advi-**
44 **sory Committee:**

45 **(1) One shall serve for a term ending July 1, 2009.**

1 (2) Two shall serve for a term ending July 1, 2010.

2 (3) Two shall serve for a term ending July 1, 2011.

3 **SECTION 11.** (1) The Oregon State Athletic Commission shall assign medical personnel
4 to each boxing or mixed martial arts event held in this state.

5 (2) Prior to the commencement of any boxing or mixed martial arts event held in this
6 state, the medical personnel assigned to the event shall certify that each contestant is
7 medically qualified to participate in the event. In determining whether to issue or withhold
8 the required certification, the assigned medical personnel shall consider:

9 (a) The results of a prefight medical examination conducted by physicians approved by
10 the commission; and

11 (b) The recent ring record of the contestant seeking certification.

12 (3) When certification under this section is withheld from a contestant, the commission
13 shall immediately notify the promoter or a representative of the promoter and any event
14 involving the medically unqualified contestant shall be canceled.

15 **SECTION 12.** ORS 463.145 is amended to read:

16 463.145. (1) [No] A member of the Oregon State [Boxing and Wrestling] Athletic Commission
17 [shall] **may not** have any financial interest or investment in any professional boxer [or wrestler],
18 **mixed martial arts competitor** or entertainment wrestler.

19 (2) [No] A member of the commission [shall] **may not** have any financial interest or investment
20 in any boxing, [wrestling] **mixed martial arts** or entertainment wrestling **event or** promotion or
21 any person or promoter involved in a boxing, [wrestling] **mixed martial arts** or entertainment
22 wrestling **event or** promotion.

23 (3) [No] **An** official, judge, referee, inspector, timekeeper or other employee or representative
24 of the commission [shall] **may not**:

25 (a) Have any financial interest or investment in [any] a professional boxer [or wrestler] **or mixed**
26 **martial arts competitor** or **an** entertainment wrestler, nor in any person or promoter involved in
27 promotion of a boxing, [wrestling] **mixed martial arts** or entertainment wrestling [cards] **event**, nor
28 in any individual promotion of [said cards] **an event**.

29 (b) Be an officer in a national or international sanctioning organization.

45 **the amendments to statutes by sections 3, 4, 5, 13, 14, 16 and 26 of this 2007 Act may not be**

1 enforced after the Superintendent of State Police adopts rules as required by the amend-
2 ments to ORS 463.113 by section 6 of this 2007 Act.

3 **SECTION 28.** ORS 463.023 and 463.135 are repealed.

4 **SECTION 29.** This 2007 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
5 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2007 Act takes effect
6 on its passage.
