Senate Bill 497

Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON RULES (at the request of Oregon Law Commission)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Requires all judicial officers, city and county elected officials, members of city or county planning, zoning or development commissions and chief executive officers of cities and counties to file statement of economic interest with Oregon Government Standards and Practices Commission.

Allows filing of amended statement of economic interest. Expands definitions of "relative" and "member of household." Modifies required contents of statement of economic interest. Directs person filing statement to list names of adult members of person's household and adult relatives who do not reside with person.

Requires public officials and candidates to file quarterly statements with commission listing gifts with value exceeding \$15 received from person with legislative or administrative interest, food, lodging or travel expenses with aggregate value exceeding \$75, honoraria of money exceeding \$15 and each source of income exceeding aggregate amount of \$1,000 from source that does business with or has legislative or administrative interest in governmental agency served by public official or candidate.

Requires person with legislative or administrative interest who gives gift with value exceeding \$15 to public official, candidate or relative to report gift to commission and to notify recipient of value of gift. Sets schedule for filing reports. Prescribes content of reports.

Updates language in statutory provisions relating to filing of statements by State Treasurer and employees of State Treasurer, filing of ethics information by members of Congress, filing of notices of conflicts of interest and provision of ethics information to newly elected or appointed public officials.

Directs Oregon Government Standards and Practices Commission to make statements filed under ethics laws available for public inspection and copying.

Repeals provisions allowing electors of cities and counties to determine whether officials of city or county must file statements of economic interest with commission.

43	(3) By April 15 next after the filing deadline for the primary election, each candidate for elective
44	public office described in subsection (1) of this section shall file with the commission a statement

(4) Within 30 days after the filing deadline for the general election, each candidate for elective 1 2 public office described in subsection (1) of this section who was not a candidate in the preceding primary election, or who was nominated for elective public office described in subsection (1) of this 3 section at the preceding primary election by write-in votes, shall file with the commission a state-4 ment of economic interest as required under ORS 244.060, 244.070 and 244.090. $\mathbf{5}$

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(5) The Legislative Assembly shall maintain a continuing review of the operation of this chapter. 7 (6) Subsections (1) to (5) of this section apply only to persons who are incumbent, elected or appointed public officials as of April 15 and to persons who are candidates for public office on April 8 9 15. [Those sections] Subsections (1) to (5) of this section also apply to persons who do not become candidates until 30 days after the filing deadline for the statewide general election. 10

(7)(a) Failure to file the statement required by this section subjects a person to a civil penalty 11 12 that may be imposed as specified in ORS 183.745, but the enforcement of this subsection does not 13 require the Oregon Government Standards and Practices Commission to follow the procedures in ORS 244.260 before finding that a violation of this section has occurred. 14

15 (b) Failure to file the required statement in timely fashion shall be prima facie evidence of a 16 violation of this section.

17 (c) If within five days after the date on which the statement is to be filed under this section the 18 statement has not been received by the commission, the commission shall notify the public official 19 and give the public official not less than 15 days to comply with the requirements of this section. 20 If the public official fails to comply by the date set by the commission, the commission may impose a civil penalty of \$5 for each day the statement is late beyond the date fixed by the commission. 2122The maximum penalty that may be accrued under this section is \$1,000.

23(d) A civil penalty imposed under this subsection is in addition to and not in lieu of sanctions that may be imposed under ORS 244.380. 24

25(8) A public official or candidate for public office may file an amended statement required by this section not later than the date set by the commission under subsection (7) of this 2627section or 30 days after the deadline to file the original statement, whichever is later. The commission may not impose a civil penalty under this section for an amended statement filed 28in compliance with this subsection. 29

30 SECTION 2. ORS 244.020 is amended to read:

31 244.020. As used in this chapter, unless the context requires otherwise:

(1) "Actual conflict of interest" means any action or any decision or recommendation by a per-32son acting in a capacity as a public official, the effect of which would be to the private pecuniary 33 34 benefit or detriment of the person or the person's relative or any business with which the person 35or a relative of the person is associated unless the pecuniary benefit or detriment arises out of circumstances described in subsection (14) of this section. 36

37 (2) "Business" means any corporation, partnership, proprietorship, firm, enterprise, franchise, 38 association, organization, self-employed individual and any other legal entity operated for economic gain but excluding any income-producing not-for-profit corporation that is tax exempt under section 39 40 501(c) of the Internal Revenue Code with which a public official or a relative of the public official is associated only as a member or board director or in a nonremunerative capacity. 41

42(3) "Business with which the person is associated" means:

(a) Any private business or closely held corporation of which the person or the person's relative 43 is a director, officer, owner or employee, or agent or any private business or closely held corpo-44 ration in which the person or the person's relative owns or has owned stock, another form of equity 45

interest, stock options or debt instruments worth \$1,000 or more at any point in the preceding calendar year;

3 (b) Any publicly held corporation in which the person or the person's relative owns or has 4 owned \$100,000 or more in stock or another form of equity interest, stock options or debt instru-5 ments at any point in the preceding calendar year;

6 (c) Any publicly held corporation of which the person or the person's relative is a director or 7 officer; or

8 (d) For public officials required to file a statement of economic interest under ORS 244.050, any 9 business from which 50 percent or more of the total annual income of the person and members of 10 the person's household is derived during the current calendar year.

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(4) "Commission" means the Oregon Government Standards and Practices Commission.

(5) "Development commission" means any entity which has the authority to purchase, develop,
improve or lease land or the authority to operate or direct the use of land. This authority must be
more than ministerial.

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(6) "Expenditure" has the meaning given that term in ORS 260.005.

16 (7) "Gift" means something of economic value given to a public official or the public official's 17 relative without valuable consideration of equivalent value, including the full or partial forgiveness 18 of indebtedness, which is not extended to others who are not public officials or the relatives of 19 public officials on the same terms and conditions; and something of economic value given to a public 20 official or the public official's relative for valuable consideration less than that required from others 21 who are not public officials. However, "gift" does not mean:

(a) Campaign contributions, as described in ORS chapter 260.

23 (b) Gifts from family members.

(c) The giving or receiving of food, lodging and travel when participating in an event which
bears a relationship to the public official's office and when appearing in an official capacity, subject
to the reporting requirement of ORS [244.060 (6)] 244.100.

(d) The giving or receiving of food or beverage if the food or beverage is consumed by the public
official or the public official's relatives in the presence of the purchaser or provider thereof.

(e) The giving or receiving of entertainment if the entertainment is experienced by the public official or the public official's relatives in the presence of the purchaser or provider thereof and the value of the entertainment does not exceed \$100 per person on a single occasion and is not greater than \$250 in any one calendar year.

(8) "Honoraria" means a payment or something of economic value given to a public official in
exchange for services upon which custom or propriety prevents the setting of a price. Services include, but are not limited to, speeches or other services rendered in connection with an event at
which the public official appears in an official capacity.

(9) "Income" means income of any nature derived from any source, including, but not limited to,
any salary, wage, advance, payment, dividend, interest, rent, honoraria, return of capital, forgiveness
of indebtedness, or anything of economic value.

(10) "Legislative or administrative interest" means an economic interest, distinct from that of
the general public, in one or more bills, resolutions, regulations, proposals or other matters subject
to the action or vote of a person acting in the capacity of a public official.

(11) "Legislative official" means any member or member-elect of the Legislative Assembly, any
member of an agency, board or committee that is part of the legislative branch and any staff person,
assistant or employee thereof.

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(12) "Member of the household" means any [relative] person who resides with the public official.

2 (13) "Planning commission" means a county planning commission created under ORS chapter 215 or a city planning commission created under ORS chapter 227. 3

(14) "Potential conflict of interest" means any action or any decision or recommendation by a 4 person acting in a capacity as a public official, the effect of which could be to the private pecuniary 5 benefit or detriment of the person or the person's relative, or a business with which the person or 6 the person's relative is associated, unless the pecuniary benefit or detriment arises out of the fol-7 lowing: 8

9 (a) An interest or membership in a particular business, industry, occupation or other class required by law as a prerequisite to the holding by the person of the office or position. 10

(b) Any action in the person's official capacity which would affect to the same degree a class 11 12 consisting of all inhabitants of the state, or a smaller class consisting of an industry, occupation or 13 other group including one of which or in which the person, or the person's relative or business with which the person or the person's relative is associated, is a member or is engaged. The commission 14 15 may by rule limit the minimum size of or otherwise establish criteria for or identify the smaller 16 classes that qualify under this exception.

(c) Membership in or membership on the board of directors of a nonprofit corporation that is 17 18 tax-exempt under section 501(c) of the Internal Revenue Code.

19 (15) "Public official" means any person who, when an alleged violation of this chapter occurs, is serving the State of Oregon or any of its political subdivisions or any other public body of the 20state as an officer, employee, agent or otherwise, and irrespective of whether the person is com-2122pensated for such services.

23(16) "Relative" means:

(a) The spouse of the public official[,]; 94

(b) The domestic partner of the public official; 25

(c) Any children of the public official or of the public official's spouse[, and brothers, sisters]; 26

27(d) Siblings, spouses of siblings or parents of the public official or of the public official's 28 spouse[.];

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(e) Any individual for whom the public official has a legal support obligation; and

30 (f) Any individual for whom the public official provides benefits arising from the public 31 official's public employment or from whom the public official receives benefits arising from that individual's employment. 32

(17) "Statement of economic interest" means a statement as described by ORS 244.060 to 244.080.

34 (18) "Statewide official" means the Secretary of State or Secretary of State-elect, State Treas-35urer or State Treasurer-elect, Superintendent of Public Instruction or Superintendent-elect of Public Instruction, Attorney General or Attorney General-elect and the Commissioner of the Bureau of 36 37 Labor and Industries or the Commissioner-elect of the Bureau of Labor and Industries.

38 (19) "Zoning commission" means an entity to which is delegated at least some of the discretionary authority of a planning commission or governing body relating to zoning and land use mat-39 40 ters.

244.060. The statement of economic interest filed under ORS 244.050[,] shall be on a form pre-42 scribed by the Oregon Government Standards and Practices Commission[, and]. The person filing the 43 statement shall supply the information required by this section and ORS 244.090, as follows: 44

(1) The [name] names of all positions as officer of a business and business directorships held 45

by the person or a member of the household of the person during the preceding calendar year, and 1

the principal address and a brief description of each business. 2

(2) All names under which the person and members of the household of the person do business 3 and the principal address and a brief description of each business. 4

(3) The names, principal addresses and brief descriptions of the five most significant $\mathbf{5}$ sources of income received at any time during the preceding calendar year by the person [or a] and 6 by each member of the household of the person [that produce 10 percent or more of the total annual 7 household income], a description of the type of income and the name of the person receiving 8 9 the income.

[(4) The name, principal address and brief description of the source of income from which 50 per-10 cent or more of the total annual income of the person and members of the household of the person was 11 12 received during the preceding calendar year and whether the source existed during the preceding year, 13 and whether the source is derived from an entity that now does business or could reasonably be expected to do business or has legislative or administrative interest in the governmental agency of which 14 15 the public official is or the candidate if elected would be a member or over which the public official has or the candidate if elected would have authority.] 16

17[(5)(a)] (4)(a) [The listing] A list of all real property in which the public official or candidate 18 [therefor] for public office or a member of the household of the public official or candidate has or has had any personal, beneficial ownership interest during the preceding calendar year, any options 19 20to purchase or sell real property, including a land sales contract, and any other rights of any kind in real property located within the geographic boundaries of the governmental agency of which the 2122public official [is] holds, or the candidate if elected would [be a member] hold, any official position 23or over which the public official [has] exercises, or the candidate if elected would [have] exercise, 24 any authority.

25(b) This subsection does not require the listing of the principal residence of the public official or candidate. 26

27[(6)(a) Notwithstanding ORS 244.020 (7)(c), if a public official has received food, lodging and payment of travel expenses exceeding \$100 when participating in an event which bears a relationship to 28the public official's office and when appearing in an official capacity, the name, nature and business 2930 address of the organization paying the expenses and the date and amount of that expenditure.]

31 [(b) Beginning on July 1, 1992, the dollar amount specified in paragraph (a) of this subsection shall be adjusted annually by the commission based upon the change in the Portland Consumer Price Index 32for All Urban Consumers for All Items as prepared by the Bureau of Labor Statistics of the United 33 34 States Department of Labor or its successor during the preceding 12-month period. 244.070. A public official or candidate for public office shall report the following additional 44 economic interest [shall be reported] for the preceding calendar year only if the source of that in-45

1 terest is derived from an individual or business [which] that has been doing business, does business 2 or could reasonably be expected to do business with, or has legislative or administrative interest 3 in, the governmental agency of which the public official [is] holds, or the candidate if elected would 4 [be a member] hold, any official position or over which the public official [has] exercises, or the 5 candidate if elected would [have] exercise, any authority:

6 [(1) Each source of income over \$1,000, other than a source of income disclosed under ORS 244.060, 7 whether or not taxable, received by the public official or candidate therefor or a member of the house-8 hold of the public official or candidate.]

9 [(2)] (1) Each person to whom the public official or candidate [therefor] for public office or a 10 member of the household of the public official or candidate owes or has owed money in excess of 11 \$1,000, the interest rate [thereon] on money owed and the date of the loan, except for debts owed 12 to any federal or state regulated financial institution or retail contracts.

[(3)] (2) [Each business] The name, principal address[,] and brief description of [its] the nature[,] of each business in which the public official or candidate [therefor] for public office or a member of the household of the public official or candidate has or has had a personal, beneficial interest or investment, including stocks or other securities, in excess of \$1,000, except for individual items involved in a mutual fund or a blind trust, or a time or demand deposit in a financial institution, shares in a credit union, or the cash surrender value of life insurance.

(1) Each public official [of this state] or candidate required to [make] file a statement 24 of economic interest **under this chapter** shall [report by] **include on the statement the** name any 25 compensated lobbyist who, during the preceding calendar year, was associated with a business with 26 which the public official or candidate or a member of the household of the public official or candi-27 date was also associated. [Holding stock in a publicly traded corporation in which the lobbyist also 28 holds stock is not a relationship for which a statement is required.]

(2) Subsection (1) of this section does not apply if the only relationship between the public
 official or candidate and the lobbyist is that the public official or candidate and lobbyist hold
 stock in the same publicly traded corporation.

[(2)] (3) As used in this section, "lobbyist" has the meaning [set forth] given that term in ORS

244.100. [(1) The Oregon Government Standards and Practices Commission by rule may require the
 disclosure and reporting of gifts or other compensation made to or received by a public official or
 candidate for elective office.]

38 [(2) The commission by rule may exempt from the gift limitation contained in ORS 244.040, any 39 gift of food or beverage but may require that when gifts of food or beverage exceed a dollar amount 40 fixed by the commission, the source thereof shall be disclosed on a form prescribed by the 41 commission.]

(1) A public official or candidate for public office who is required to file a statement of
economic interest under ORS 244.050 shall file with the Oregon Government Standards and
Practices Commission, according to the schedule set forth in section 8 of this 2007 Act, a
statement showing for the applicable reporting period:

(c) Any honorarium of money exceeding \$15 received by the public official, candidate or
 member of the household of the official or candidate, the payer of each honorarium and the
 date and time of the event for which the honorarium was received.

(d) Each source of income exceeding an aggregate amount of \$1,000, whether or not tax-16 able, received by the public official or candidate for public office, or a member of the 17 household of the public official or candidate, if the source of that income is derived from an 18 individual or business that has been doing business, does business or could reasonably be 19 expected to do business with, or has legislative or administrative interest in, the govern-20mental agency of which the public official holds, or the candidate if elected would hold, any 2122official position or over which the public official exercises, or the candidate if elected would 23exercise, any authority.

(2) A person who makes a gift with a value exceeding \$15 that is subject to the \$100 limit 24 specified in ORS 244.040 to a public official or candidate for public office who is required to 25file a statement of economic interest under ORS 244.050, or to a relative of the public official 2627or candidate, shall file a statement of gifts made with the commission according to the schedule set forth in section 8 of this 2007 Act. If the person making a gift is a lobbyist 28registered with the commission under ORS 171.725 to 171.785, any gifts subject to this sub-29section may be reported on statements filed under ORS 171.745. A statement filed under this 30 31 subsection shall include the name and address of the person filing the statement, the name of each person who received a gift, the date each gift was made, the value of each gift and 32a description of the nature of each gift. The commission by rule may require additional in-33 34 formation.

(3) In addition to [any disclosures or reports] statements required under subsections (1) and (2)
of this section[,]:

(a) [Any] A person [or organization that] who provides a public official with food, lodging or
travel expenses exceeding [\$50] an aggregate value of \$75[, as described in ORS 244.060 (6),] shall
notify the public official in writing of the amount of the expense. The person shall provide the
notice [shall be sent] to the public official [within 10 days from] not later than 10 days after the
date [such] the expenses are incurred.

(b) A person who makes a gift to a public official or candidate for public office, or to a relative of a public official or candidate, that must be listed on a statement filed under subsection (1) of this section shall notify the public official or candidate in writing of the value of the gift. The person shall provide the notice not later than five days after the date the

1 person makes the gift.
