## SENATE AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 517

On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 4 through 28.

On page 2, delete lines 1 through 14 and insert: "SECTION 1. As used in sections 2 and 3 of this 2007 Act: 3 "(1) 'Anabolic steroid' includes any drug or hormonal substance chemically or 5 pharmacologically related to testosterone. all prohormones. including dehydroepiandrosterone and all substances listed in the Anabolic Steroid Control Act of 2004. 6 steroid' 7 'Anabolic does not include estrogens, progestins, corticosteroids mineralocorticoids. 8 9 "(2) 'Performance-enhancing substance' means a manufactured product for oral 10 ingestion, intranasal application or inhalation containing compounds that: 11 "(a) Contain a stimulant, amino acid, hormone precursor, herb or other botanical or any 12 other substance other than an essential vitamin or mineral; and 13 "(b) Are intended to increase athletic performance, promote muscle growth, induce 14 weight loss or increase an individual's endurance or capacity for exercise. 15 "(3) 'School district employee' means: "(a) An administrator, teacher or other person employed by a school district; 16 17 "(b) A person who volunteers for a school district; and 18 "(c) A person who is performing services on behalf of a school district pursuant to a 19 contract. 20 "SECTION 2. A school district employee may not: 21 "(1) Knowingly sell, market or distribute an anabolic steroid or performance-enhancing 22 substance to a kindergarten through grade 12 student with whom the employee has contact 23 as part of the employee's school district duties; or 24 "(2) Knowingly endorse or suggest the ingestion, intranasal application or inhalation of 25 an anabolic steroid or performance-enhancing substance by a kindergarten through grade 12 student with whom the employee has contact as part of the employee's school district duties. 26 27 "SECTION 3. (1) The Department of Education shall work in conjunction with voluntary 28 organizations approved to administer interscholastic activities under ORS 339.430 to develop 29 and implement a program for kindergarten through grade 12 students of evidence-based education to prevent the use of anabolic steroids and performance-enhancing substances. 30 31 "(2) The department and school districts shall include information on anabolic steroids 32 and performance-enhancing substances, including prevention strategies, strength-building alternatives and the understanding of health food labels, in health and physical education 33

"(3) The department shall ensure that school districts are utilizing programs such as the

curricula.

Oregon Health and Science University's Athletes Training and Learning to Avoid Steroids (ATLAS) and Athletes Targeting Healthy Exercise and Nutrition Alternatives (ATHENA), which have demonstrated effectiveness in reducing anabolic steroid and performance-enhancing substance use by high school athletes.

"(4) The department shall require school district employees who are coaches or athletic directors to receive training once every four years on identifying the components of anabolic steroid abuse and use and prevention strategies for the use of performance-enhancing substances.".
