SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to State Department of Geology and Mineral Industries for biennial expenses.

Limits biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and specified federal funds, but excluding lottery funds and other federal funds, collected or received by department.

Limits biennial expenditures by department from certain federal funds. Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2007.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to financial administration of the State Department of Geology and Mineral Industries;

3 appropriating money; limiting expenditures; and declaring an emergency.

4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

5 <u>SECTION 1.</u> There is appropriated to the State Department of Geology and Mineral In-

6 dustries, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, out of the General Fund, the following

7 amounts for the following purposes:

8 (1) Operations of the department .. \$ 3,190,028

9 (2) Debt service \$ 116,903

10 <u>SECTION 2.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of 11 \$7,803,343 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, as the maximum limit for 12 payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including federal funds for con-13 tract services and Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not 14 described in this section, collected or received by the State Department of Geology and 15 Mineral Industries.

SECTION 3. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$2,219,955 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds other than those described in section 2 of this 2007 Act, collected or received by the State Department of Geology and Mineral Industries.

20 <u>SECTION 4.</u> This 2007 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 21 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2007 Act takes effect 22 July 1, 2007.
