## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Limits certain biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by Oregon Liquor Control Commission.

Authorizes specified nonlimited expenditures. Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2007.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to financial administration of the Oregon Liquor Control Commission; limiting expenditures;

3 and declaring an emergency.

4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

5 <u>SECTION 1.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts

6 are established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, as the maximum limits for payment

7 of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but ex-

8 cluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Oregon Liquor Control

9 Commission, for the following purposes:

10 (1) Administrative expenses ...... \$ 47,283,584

11 (2) Agents' compensation..... \$ 75,685,000

12 (3) Capital improvements ...... \$ 210,083

13 <u>SECTION 2.</u> For the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, expenditures by the Oregon Liquor

14 Control Commission for liquor purchases are not limited.

15 SECTION 3. This 2007 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public

peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2007 Act takes effect on July 1, 2007.
