SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Limits biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by Real Estate Agency. **Increases expenditure limitation of agency for biennium ending June 30, 2007.** Declares emergency, effective [July 1, 2007] **on passage**.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to financial administration of the Real Estate Agency; limiting expenditures; and declaring

3 an emergency.

4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of $\mathbf{5}$ \$7,790,247 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, as the maximum limit for 6 payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, 7 but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Real Estate 8 Agency. 9 SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures of the Real Estate 10 Agency for the payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscel-11 laneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, for the biennium ending June 12 30, 2007, the limitation on expenditures for the Real Estate Agency established by section 1, 13 chapter 602, Oregon Laws 2005, as modified by Emergency Board action, is increased by 14

15 **\$50,957.**

SECTION 3. This 2007 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2007 Act takes effect on its passage.
