Senate Bill 631

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Increases maximum amount of time credits earned for reduction in term of incarceration to 33 percent of total term of incarceration.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to incarceration; amending ORS 421.121.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. ORS 421.121 is amended to read:

- 421.121. (1) Except as provided in ORS 137.635, each inmate sentenced to the custody of the Department of Corrections for felonies committed on or after November 1, 1989, shall be eligible for a reduction in the term of incarceration for appropriate institutional behavior, as defined by rule of the Department of Corrections, and for participation in the functional literacy program described in ORS 421.084.
- (2) The maximum amount of time credits earned for appropriate institutional behavior or for participation in the functional literacy program described in ORS 421.084 [shall] may not exceed [20] 33 percent of the total term of incarceration in a Department of Corrections institution.
- (3) The time credits [shall] **may** not be used to shorten the term of actual prison confinement to less than six months.
- (4) The department shall adopt rules pursuant to the rulemaking provisions of ORS chapter 183 to establish a process for granting, retracting and restoring the time credits earned by the offender as allowed in subsections (1) to (3) of this section.
