

Senate Bill 639

Sponsored by Senator G GEORGE; Senator MORSE, Representatives CLEM, DALLUM, THATCHER

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Allows person to be represented by authorized representative if person is participating in contested case hearing conducted by Department of Human Services.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to contested case proceedings; amending ORS 183.457; and declaring an emergency.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1.** ORS 183.457 is amended to read:

5 183.457. (1) Notwithstanding ORS 8.690, 9.160 and 9.320, [*and unless otherwise authorized by an-*
6 *other law,*] a person participating in a contested case hearing conducted by an agency described in
7 this subsection may be represented by an attorney or by an authorized representative subject to the
8 provisions of subsection (2) of this section. The Attorney General shall prepare model rules for
9 proceedings with lay representation that do not have the effect of precluding lay representation.
10 No rule adopted by a state agency shall have the effect of precluding lay representation. The
11 agencies before which an authorized representative may appear are:

12 (a) The State Landscape Contractors Board in the administration of the Landscape Contractors
13 Law.

14 (b) The State Department of Energy and the Energy Facility Siting Council.

15 (c) The Environmental Quality Commission and the Department of Environmental Quality.

16 (d) The Department of Consumer and Business Services for proceedings in which an insured
17 appears pursuant to ORS 737.505.

18 (e) The Department of Consumer and Business Services and any other agency for the purpose
19 of proceedings to enforce the state building code, as defined by ORS 455.010.

20 (f) The State Fire Marshal in the Department of State Police.

21 (g) The Department of State Lands for proceedings regarding the issuance or denial of fill or
22 removal permits under ORS 196.800 to 196.825.

23 (h) The Public Utility Commission.

24 (i) The Water Resources Commission and the Water Resources Department.

25 (j) The Land Conservation and Development Commission and the Department of Land Conser-
26 vation and Development.

27 (k) The State Department of Agriculture, for purposes of hearings under ORS 215.705.

28 (L) The Bureau of Labor and Industries.

29 **(m) The Department of Human Services.**

30 (2) A person participating in a contested case hearing as provided in subsection (1) of this sec-
31 tion may appear by an authorized representative if:

1 (a) The agency conducting the contested case hearing has determined that appearance of such
2 a person by an authorized representative will not hinder the orderly and timely development of the
3 record in the type of contested case hearing being conducted;

4 (b) The agency conducting the contested case hearing allows, by rule, authorized representatives
5 to appear on behalf of such participants in the type of contested case hearing being conducted; and

6 (c) The officer presiding at the contested case hearing may exercise discretion to limit an au-
7 thorized representative's presentation of evidence, examination and cross-examination of witnesses,
8 or presentation of factual arguments to ensure the orderly and timely development of the hearing
9 record, and shall not allow an authorized representative to present legal arguments except to the
10 extent authorized under subsection (3) of this section.

11 (3) The officer presiding at a contested case hearing in which an authorized representative ap-
12 pears under the provisions of this section may allow the authorized representative to present evi-
13 dence, examine and cross-examine witnesses, and make arguments relating to the:

14 (a) Application of statutes and rules to the facts in the contested case;

15 (b) Actions taken by the agency in the past in similar situations;

16 (c) Literal meaning of the statutes or rules at issue in the contested case;

17 (d) Admissibility of evidence; and

18 (e) Proper procedures to be used in the contested case hearing.

19 (4) Upon judicial review, no limitation imposed by an agency presiding officer on the partic-
20 ipation of an authorized representative shall be the basis for reversal or remand of agency action
21 unless the limitation resulted in substantial prejudice to a person entitled to judicial review of the
22 agency action.

23 (5) For the purposes of this section, "authorized representative" means a member of a partic-
24 ipating partnership, an authorized officer or regular employee of a participating corporation, asso-
25 ciation or organized group, or an authorized officer or employee of a participating governmental
26 authority other than a state agency.

27 **SECTION 2. This 2007 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**
28 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2007 Act takes effect**
29 **on its passage.**

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
