Senate Bill 672

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Requires person setting traps for certain animals to check trap at least once during each 24-hour period.

2	Relating to wildlife traps; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 498.172.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. ORS 498.172 is added to and made a part of ORS chapter 498.
5	SECTION 2. ORS 498.172 is amended to read:
6	498.172. (1) [A person holding a license issued under ORS 497.142 may not set a trap for fur-
7	bearing mammals without checking the trap at least once during each 48-hour period.] A person shall
8	check each trap set by the person for badger, beaver, bobcat, coyote, fisher, gray fox,
9	marten, mink, muskrat, nutria, opossum, otter, rabbit, raccoon, red fox, spotted skunk,
10	striped skunk and weasel at least once during each 24-hour period.
11	(2) A person may not set a trap for a predatory animal, as defined in ORS 610.002, that is not
12	listed in subsection (1) of this section without checking the trap on a regular basis.
