## SUMMARY

Requires Legislative Counsel to solicit bids for printing of Oregon Revised Statutes each biennium.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to the printing of Oregon Revised Statutes; creating new provisions; amending ORS 171.275; 2 and declaring an emergency.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 4

SECTION 1. ORS 171.275 is amended to read: 5

171.275. (1) Each biennium, the Legislative Counsel, under the direction of the Legislative 6 Counsel Committee, shall publish and distribute the Oregon Revised Statutes, including an index and 7

annotations. 8

(2) Each biennium, the Legislative Counsel shall solicit bids for the printing of the 9 10 **Oregon Revised Statutes.** 

[(2)] (3) The Legislative Counsel Committee shall establish policies for the revision, clarification, 11 12 classification, arrangement, codification, annotation, indexing, printing, binding, publication, copy-

13 righting, sale and distribution of the publications referred to in subsection (1) of this section.

[(3)] (4) The Legislative Counsel Committee shall establish the charges necessary to recover the 14 costs of publishing the materials sold and distributed under this section. 15

16 SECTION 2. The amendments to ORS 171.725 by section 1 of this 2007 Act apply to the printing of the 2007 Edition of the Oregon Revised Statutes and all subsequent editions. 17

SECTION 3. This 2007 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 18 19 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2007 Act takes effect 20 on its passage.
