Senate Bill 865

Sponsored by Senator METSGER; Senator MORRISETTE

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Directs Department of Human Services, after application for and approval of federal waiver, to disregard amount of annual cost-of-living adjustment for monthly Social Security and Supplemental Security Income benefits when determining financial eligibility for food stamp benefits.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to food stamp benefits; and declaring an emergency.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> Section 2 of this 2007 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 411.806 to 5 411.845.

6 SECTION 2. (1) The Department of Human Services shall seek approval from the United

States Department of Agriculture under 7 U.S.C. 2026 to disregard the amount of the annual
cost-of-living adjustment for Social Security benefits and for Supplemental Security Income

9 benefits in determining eligibility for food stamp benefits.

(2) Upon receipt of federal approval to disregard the cost-of-living adjustment for Social
 Security benefits or Supplemental Security Income benefits, the department shall imme diately adopt temporary rules consistent with the federal approval.

<u>SECTION 3.</u> The Department of Human Services shall annually renew an application approved by the United States Department of Agriculture under section 2 of this 2007 Act.

15 <u>SECTION 4.</u> The Department of Human Services shall submit the request for approval
 16 under section 2 of this 2007 Act no later than October 1, 2007.

17 <u>SECTION 5.</u> This 2007 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 18 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2007 Act takes effect 19 on its passage.
