SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Requires Department of Human Services and local mental health authorities to work together to create local and regional plans providing services to persons with mental health disorders. Requires department to report to Legislative Assembly. Appropriates moneys from General Fund for biennium beginning July 1, 2007, to department for purposes of creating and implementing plans.

3 Whereas the Oregon Legislative Assembly commissioned an Oregon State Hospital Master Plan

4 Report to make recommendations for a new hospital facility; and

5 Whereas the Oregon State Hospital Master Plan Report emphasized the importance of commu-

6 nity residential beds and community-based continuum of care services to reduce reliance on state 7 hospital facility beds; and

8 Whereas the Oregon State Hospital community services workgroup has reviewed the master 9 plan directions and made recommendations regarding regional and local needs to fulfill the state 10 hospital master plan; now, therefore,

11 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

12 <u>SECTION 1.</u> Section 2 of this 2007 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 430.610 to 13 430.670.

SECTION 2. (1) The Department of Human Services and local mental health authorities, as defined in ORS 430.630, shall work together to create local and regional plans for an expanded community-based continuum of care services as outlined in the second phase of the Oregon State Hospital Master Plan.

(2) The plans shall include, but not be limited to, the following services for persons with
mental health disorders and for persons with both mental health and substance use disor ders:

(a) A range of housing from specialized residential care to affordable and supportive in dependent housing;

- 23 (b) Full-time mobile crisis services and acute, subacute and crisis respite care;
- 24 (c) Assertive Community Treatment teams;
- 25 (d) Care coordination and effective client-driven treatment services;
- 26 (e) Supported employment;

(f) Supported education; 1 2 (g) Early intervention programs; (h) Integrated treatment for multiple disorders: 3 (i) Illness self-management and recovery programs; 4 (j) Medications and medication management; 5 (k) Family and community education; 6 (L) Suicide prevention programs; 7 (m) Peer-delivered support and services; 8 9 (n) Gatekeeper programs and mobile outreach services for older adults, the homeless and 10 other at-risk individuals; (o) Diversion and reentry from criminal justice systems, including mental health courts 11 12 and jail diversion programs; and 13 (p) Mental health and substance use expertise and collaborative care in school-based clinics, federally qualified health clinics and other primary care locations. 14 15(3) To the extent funds are available, the Department of Human Services may provide funding to assist local and regional plan development under this section. 16 SECTION 3. The Department of Human Services must use the most current population 17 18 data available in calculating state funding for all community mental health and addiction services for which an allocation formula can be used. Related state funding must include 19 20community mental health and addiction services to non-Medicaid eligible adults and children and for crisis, acute psychiatric and continuum of care alcohol and drug treatment services. 2122SECTION 4. (1) The Department of Human Services shall begin implementation of 23community-based services in the counties and regions included in the plans for expanded community-based continuum of care services described in section 2 of this 2007 Act no later 2425than December 31, 2008. (2) The Department of Human Services shall report to the Seventy-fifth Legislative As-2627sembly in the manner provided in ORS 192.245 on the services identified in local and regional plans and the budget requirements for implementation of those services. The report shall 28include information on any implementation of the plans under this section. 29

30 <u>SECTION 5.</u> There is appropriated to the Department of Human Services, for the 31 biennium beginning July 1, 2007, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$105,090,000 for the 32 purpose of carrying out the provisions of sections 2 to 4 of this 2007 Act.

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
