## Senate Bill 881

Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON HEALTH POLICY AND PUBLIC AFFAIRS (at the request of Association of Oregon Community Mental Health Programs)

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires Department of Human Services and local mental health authorities to work together to create local and regional plans providing services to persons with mental health disorders. Requires department to report to Legislative Assembly.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to community-based services.

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3 Whereas the Oregon Legislative Assembly commissioned an Oregon State Hospital Master Plan 4 Report to make recommendations for a new hospital facility; and

5 Whereas the Oregon State Hospital Master Plan Report emphasized the importance of commu-

6 nity residential beds and community-based continuum of care services to reduce reliance on state 7 hospital facility beds; and

8 Whereas the Oregon State Hospital community services workgroup has reviewed the master

9 plan directions and made recommendations regarding regional and local needs to fulfill the state

10 hospital master plan; now, therefore,

11 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

12 <u>SECTION 1.</u> Section 2 of this 2007 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 430.610 to 13 430.670.

14 <u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) The Department of Human Services and local mental health authorities,

15 as defined in ORS 430.630, shall work together to create local and regional plans for an ex-

panded community-based continuum of care services as outlined in the second phase of the
 Oregon State Hospital Master Plan.

(2) The plans shall include, but not be limited to, the following services for persons with
 mental health disorders and for persons with both mental health and substance use disor ders:

(a) A range of housing from specialized residential care to affordable and supportive in dependent housing;

- 23 (b) Full-time mobile crisis services and acute, subacute and crisis respite care;
- 24 (c) Assertive Community Treatment teams;
- 25 (d) Care coordination and effective client-driven treatment services;
- 26 (e) Supported employment;
- 27 (f) Supported education;
- 28 (g) Early intervention programs;
- 29 (h) Integrated treatment for multiple disorders;
- 30 (i) Illness self-management and recovery programs;

1 (j) Medications and medication management;

2 (k) Family and community education;

- 3 (L) Suicide prevention programs;
- 4 (m) Peer-delivered support and services;

5 (n) Gatekeeper programs and mobile outreach services for older adults, the homeless and
6 other at-risk individuals;

(o) Diversion and reentry from criminal justice systems, including mental health courts
 and jail diversion programs; and

9 (p) Mental health and substance use expertise and collaborative care in school-based 10 clinics, federally qualified health clinics and other primary care locations.

(3) To the extent funds are available, the Department of Human Services may provide
 funding to assist local and regional plan development under this section.

<u>SECTION 3.</u> (1) Subject to available funding, during the 2007-2009 biennium, the Depart ment of Human Services shall begin implementation of community-based services in counties
 and regions that are ready to begin delivery of services under the plans created under section
 1 of this 2007 Act.

(2) The Department of Human Services shall report to the Seventy-fifth Legislative Assembly in the manner provided in ORS 192.245 on the services identified in local and regional plans and the budget requirements for implementation of those services. The report shall include information on any implementation of the plans under this section.

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
