74th OREGON LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY--2007 Regular Session

Senate Bill 940

Sponsored by Senator G GEORGE

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Creates Sunset Advisory Commission. Specifies membership of commission. Requires state agencies subject to abolition to make report to commission. Requires commission to conduct performance evaluation of agency based on specified criteria and make recommendations to Governor and Legislative Assembly relating to abolition, continuation or reorganization of agency and other matters.

A BILL FOR AN ACT 1 2 Relating to Sunset Advisory Commission. Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 3 SECTION 1. Definitions. As used in sections 1 to 14 of this 2007 Act: 4 (1) "State agency" means an agency in the executive department, as defined in ORS 5 6 174.112, expressly made subject to sections 1 to 14 of this 2007 Act. 7 (2) "Commission" means the Sunset Advisory Commission. SECTION 2. Commission created. (1) The Sunset Advisory Commission is created and 8 9 consists of: 10 (a) Five members of the Senate, and a public member, appointed by the President of the Senate; and 11 12 (b) Five members of the House of Representatives, and a public member, appointed by 13 the Speaker of the House. (2) Members of the commission serve four-year terms. 14 (3) A public member may not serve more than two consecutive terms. A public member 15 is considered to have served a term for the purposes of this subsection only if the member 16 has served more than half of the term. 17 (4) If a vacancy occurs, the appropriate appointing authority shall appoint a person to 18 serve for the remainder of the unexpired term. 19 20 (5) The commission shall have a chairperson and vice-chairperson as presiding officers. (6) Seven members of the commission constitute a quorum. A final action or recom-21 mendation may not be made unless approved by a vote of a majority of the commission's full 22 23membership. 24 (7) A public member of the commission is entitled to reimbursement for actual and necessary expenses incurred in performing commission duties as provided in ORS 292.495. A 25 26 legislative member is entitled to payment of compensation and expenses under ORS 171.072 27from funds appropriated to the Legislative Assembly. 28 SECTION 3. Staff. (1) The Sunset Advisory Commission shall employ an executive direc-29 tor for the commission. 30 (2) The executive director shall employ persons necessary to carry out sections 1 to 14 **NOTE:** Matter in **boldfaced** type in an amended section is new: matter *[italic and bracketed]* is existing law to be omitted. 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of this 2007 Act with funds made available by the legislature. 1 2 (3) The chairperson and vice-chairperson of the commission may each employ a staff to work on matters related to commission activities. 3 SECTION 4. Agency report to commission. Before January 1 of the calendar year before 4 the year in which a state agency is abolished, the state agency shall report to the Sunset 5 **Advisory Commission:** 6 (1) Information regarding the application to the state agency of the criteria in section 8 7 of this 2007 Act; and 8 9 (2) Any other information that the state agency considers appropriate or that is re-10 quested by the commission. SECTION 5. Commission duties. Before June 1 of the calendar year before the year in 11 12which a state agency is abolished, the Sunset Advisory Commission shall: 13 (1) Review and take action necessary to verify the reports submitted by the state agency under section 4 of this 2007 Act; 14 15 (2) Conduct a performance evaluation of the state agency based on the criteria provided in section 8 of this 2007 Act and prepare a written report; and 16 (3) Review the implementation of commission recommendations contained in the reports 17presented to the legislature during the preceding legislative session. 18 19 SECTION 6. Public hearings. (1) Between June 1 and December 1 of the calendar year before the year in which a state agency is abolished, the Sunset Advisory Commission shall 20conduct public hearings concerning but not limited to the application to the state agency of 2122the criteria provided in section 8 of this 2007 Act. 23(2) The commission may hold the public hearings before the date specified by subsection (1) of this section if the evaluation of the state agency required by section 5 of this 2007 Act 94 is complete and available to the public. 25SECTION 7. Commission report. (1) At each regular session, the Sunset Advisory Com-2627mission shall present to the Legislature Assembly and the Governor a report on the state agencies scheduled to be abolished. 28(2) In the report required by this section the commission shall include: 2930 (a) The commission's specific findings regarding each of the criteria prescribed by section 31 8 of this 2007 Act; (b) The commission's recommendations based on the matters prescribed by section 9 of 32this 2007 Act; and 33 34 (c) Other information the commission considers necessary for a complete evaluation of 35the state agency. SECTION 8. Criteria for review. The Sunset Advisory Commission shall consider the fol-36 37 lowing criteria in determining whether a public need exists for the continuation of a state agency or for the performance of the functions of the state agency: 38 (1) The efficiency with which the state agency operates. 39 (2) An evaluation of the mission of the state agency, including the problem or need that 40 the state agency was intended to address, the extent to which the objectives have been 41 achieved and any activities of the state agency in addition to those granted by statute and 42 the authority for those activities. 43 (3) Whether there are less restrictive or alternative methods of performing any regu-44 lation that the state agency performs that could adequately protect the public. 45

SECTION 10. Monitoring of recommendations. During each legislative session, the staff 37 38 of the Sunset Advisory Commission shall monitor legislation affecting state agencies that have undergone sunset review and shall periodically report to the members of the commis-39 sion on proposed changes that would modify prior recommendations of the commission. 40

SECTION 11. Subpoena power. (1) The Sunset Advisory Commission may issue process 41 to compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of books, records, papers and other 42 43

(2) If a majority of the commission directs the issuance of a subpoena, the chairperson 44 45

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(3) A witness who attends a commission proceeding under process is entitled to the same 1 2 mileage and per diem as a witness who appears before a grand jury in this state. SECTION 12. Assistance of and access to state agencies. (1) State agencies shall assist 3 the Sunset Advisory Commission upon request by the commission or the commission's staff. 4 (2) In carrying out its functions under sections 1 to 14 of this 2007 Act, the commission 5 or its designated staff member may inspect the records, documents and files of any state 6 7 agency. SECTION 13. Relocation of employees. If an employee is displaced because a state agency 8 9 is abolished, reorganized or continued, the state agency and the Employment Department shall make a reasonable effort to relocate the displaced employee. 10 SECTION 14. Review of proposed legislation creating regulatory agency. (1) Each bill filed 11 12in a the Legislative Assembly that would create a new state agency having regulatory authority shall be forwarded by the Legislative Fiscal Officer to the Sunset Advisory Commis-13 sion. 14 15 (2) The commission shall review a bill forwarded to the commission under this section to determine if: 16 (a) The proposed functions of the state agency could be performed by an existing state 1718 agency; (b) The form of regulation proposed by the bill is the least restrictive form of regulation 19 that will adequately protect the public; 20(c) The bill provides for adequate public input relating to the regulatory function pro-2122posed by the bill; and 23(d) The bill provides for adequate protection against conflicts of interest within the state 24 agency or committee. (3) After reviewing a bill under this section, the commission shall forward a written 25comment on the legislation to the chairs of committees considering the bill. 2627SECTION 15. The section captions used in this 2007 Act are provided only for the convenience of the reader and do not become part of the statutory law of this state or express 28any legislative intent in the enactment of this 2007 Act. 29

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
