Senate Bill 943

Sponsored by Senator G GEORGE (at the request of Oregon State Grange)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Directs Department of Transportation to construct limited access highway between Port of Coos Bay and Ontario.

Refers Act to people for their approval or rejection at next regular general election.

2	Relating to construction of highways; and providing that this Act shall be referred to the people for
3	their approval or rejection.
4	Whereas researchers at Portland State University's Population Research Center predict that by
5	2025, there will be one million more residents in Oregon; and
6	Whereas traffic flow in the Portland metropolitan area exceeds highway design capabilities,
7	creating congestion, increasing accident potential and negatively impacting the quality of life for
8	metropolitan-area residents; and
9	Whereas much of the traffic congestion results from a lack of alternative highway routes for
10	southwest Oregon and northern California traffic heading to the north and east of this state, forcing
11	all traffic to flow through the Portland metropolitan area; and
12	Whereas constructing highways in rural areas of the state is more cost-efficient than adding
13	highway lanes in urban areas; and
14	Whereas much of Oregon's motor carrier traffic runs through school zones and the centers of
15	small towns, creating safety hazards and congestion; and
16	Whereas Interstate 84 is vulnerable to seismic events and other natural disasters, which could
17	seriously jeopardize Oregon's economy; and
18	Whereas an alternate east-west highway to Interstate 84 is needed in Oregon; and
19	Whereas Oregon needs to divert the population growth; and
20	Whereas a limited access highway is an excellent tool for land-use management through limited
21	access points; and
22	Whereas a limited access highway will boost the economic development of rural areas; and
23	Whereas there are many alternative funding options to construct a limited access highway in
24	Oregon; now, therefore,
25	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
26	SECTION 1. (1) The Department of Transportation shall construct a limited access
27	highway from the Port of Coos Bay to Ontario.
28	(2) Before proceeding with construction, the department shall determine what portion
29	of the costs of construction and maintenance could be recovered through tolls on users of
30	the limited access highway.
31	SECTION 2. This 2007 Act shall be submitted to the people for their approval or rejection

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1 at the next regular general election held throughout this state.

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
