2 Relating to commerce.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) Vendors selling or offering for sale a product or service that persons are 5 required by law or rules adopted thereunder to purchase, wear or otherwise use shall sell 6 or offer for sale the product or service:

7 (a) At a price no higher than that set by the Attorney General; and

8 (b) Only if the product or service has been approved and certified by the Department of

9 Transportation in the case of vehicle-related products or services, or by the Department of
10 Consumer and Business Services in the case of other products or services.

(2) The Attorney General shall by rule define the terms "product" and "service" for the
purposes of this section.

(3) The Attorney General shall consider the economic status of the typical users of the
product or service and the vendors' costs, including reasonable profit, of producing, acquiring
or offering the product or service, in determining the maximum price for a product or ser-
