Senate Joint Memorial 4

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Urges Congress to prioritize family reunification in federal immigration reform.

2	To the Senate and the House of Representatives of the United States of America, in Congress as
3	sembled:
4	We, your memorialists, the Seventy-fourth Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon, in leg
5	islative session assembled, respectfully represent as follows:
6	Whereas families in Oregon are separated, or threatened by the prospect of separation, by th
7	broken immigration laws and regulations that span the State of Oregon and the nation; and
8	Whereas children who are citizens of the United States are being separated from their father
9	and mothers because of broken immigration laws; and
10	Whereas a child's separation from family members violates the right to family unity and cause
11	children who are United States citizens great emotional and financial harm; and
12	Whereas mothers or fathers of citizen children are, in many cases, married to United State
13	citizens, and the hardship experienced by these families due to the separation, or imminent separation
14	ration, of their families is ultimately hardship experienced by United States citizens; and
15	Whereas immigration cases illuminate a wide range of legal situations and human experience
16	that are important and instructive to the immigration debate in Congress; and
17	Whereas it is the right of every United States citizen to grow up in the citizen's country of birth
18	with family, including parents, siblings, aunts, uncles and grandparents, and this right is of utmos
19	importance and equal to any other right granted to United States citizens; now, therefore,
20	Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:
21	That we, the members of the Seventy-fourth Legislative Assembly, respectfully urge the Con
22	gress of the United States to take action on federal immigration reform that will provide for family
23	unification as part of comprehensive immigration reform; and be it further
24	Resolved, That a copy of this memorial shall be sent to each member of the Oregon Congres
25	sional Delegation.
