**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:** Permits school district to request waiver from Department of Education that allows district to administer grade 10 assessment from contractor other than state-selected contractor. Requires department to grant waiver for 2008-2009 only if district had contract to administer grade 10 assessment for 2007-2008 school year and contractor meets same criteria as state-selected contractor. Permits State Board of Education to adopt rules to waive grade 10 assessment for specific groups of students. Declares emergency; effective upon passage.

## **EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:** No amendment.

**BACKGROUND:** House Bill 2263 (2007) required the Department of Education to contract with a non-profit entity to administer a nationally-normed assessment to all public school students in grade 10. Several school districts are using a vendor to administer this type of assessment within their districts. Currently, districts using a vendor other than the one chosen by the department to administer the statewide contract would not be permitted to continue use of the same test. House Bill 3600-A would allow school districts to continue to use a vendor other than the one selected to administer the statewide contract for the 2008-2009 academic year only.
