**SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

In memoriam: Scott Zimbrick, 1955-2007.

**CONCURRENT RESOLUTION**

2       Whereas Scott Zimbrick was born in 1955 in Lebanon, Oregon, and graduated from Lebanon  
3 High School in 1973; and

4       Whereas Scott Zimbrick was a graduate of Linn-Benton Community College and the University  
5 of Oregon; and

6       Whereas Scott Zimbrick married his wife Kathy in 1987 and they chose Corvallis as their home  
7 in 1991; and

8       Whereas Scott Zimbrick committed his life to professional excellence as a mission-driven banker  
9 as Executive Vice President of Citizens Bank in Corvallis; and

10       Whereas Scott Zimbrick demonstrated a passionate commitment to building a healthy and livable  
11 community in the City of Corvallis and therefore served on the boards of 20 different civic and  
12 nonprofit organizations over the course of 16 years; and

13       Whereas Scott Zimbrick expressed his belief that Linn-Benton Community College gave him the  
14 foundation necessary to pursue an education; and

15       Whereas Scott Zimbrick was honored with the Linn-Benton Community College Distinguished  
16 Alumni Award; and

17       Whereas Scott Zimbrick was a key leader in affordable housing initiatives in the community,  
18 including his work with Corvallis Neighborhood Housing Services, believing that individuals work-  
19 ing in Corvallis should be able to afford to live in Corvallis; and

20       Whereas Scott Zimbrick contributed to the economic vitality of the City of Corvallis through  
21 his membership in the Economic Vitality Partnership, the Corvallis-Benton Chamber Coalition,  
22 Corvallis Neighborhood Housing Services and the Linn-Benton Business Education Compact; and

23       Whereas Scott Zimbrick was recognized by his community as Corvallis First Citizen in 2003  
24 because of his generous commitment to volunteerism and civic service; and

25       Whereas Scott Zimbrick was elected to the Corvallis City Council in 2001, serving for two years  
26 as Vice President, and continued his service until his death; and

27       Whereas Scott Zimbrick demonstrated the importance of family through his public commitment  
28 to his children, Billy and Lindsey, and their many school and athletic activities; and

1       Whereas, Kathy, Lindsey and Billy supported and contributed to Scott Zimbrick's devotion to  
2 their community by sharing his time and talents with all of the citizens of Corvallis; and

3       Whereas the citizens of the City of Corvallis were deeply grieved by Scott Zimbrick's sudden  
4 death on December 6, 2007, at the age of 52; now, therefore,

5 **Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:**

6       That we, the members of the Seventy-fourth Legislative Assembly, in special session assembled,  
7 recognize, honor and express our state's gratitude for Scott Zimbrick's life of community service and  
8 commitment to improving the lives of fellow Oregonians; and be it further

9       Resolved, That a copy of this resolution shall be presented to his wife, Kathy Zimbrick, and their  
10 children, Lindsey and Billy, as an expression of our esteem, appreciation and condolences.
