## **Senate Concurrent Resolution 23**

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 1 2 Whereas the Oregon Century Farm and Ranch Program was founded in 1958 and is administered 3 through the Oregon Agricultural Education Foundation, a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization; and 4 Whereas the mission of the Oregon Century Farm and Ranch Program is to generate pride and $\mathbf{5}$ a greater public awareness of the role family-owned farms and ranches play in the economic and 6 social vitality of Oregon; and 7 Whereas the Oregon Century Farm and Ranch Program honors families that have continuously 8 owned and operated the same farms and ranches for 100 or more years; and 9 Whereas there are more than 1,075 farm and ranch families that have achieved that 100-year 10 milestone; and 11 Whereas century farms and ranches are located in all but one of Oregon's counties; and 12Whereas Oregon Century Farm and Ranch Program families receive a certificate of acknowledgement from the Governor and the Director of Agriculture; and 13 14 Whereas colorful road signs are available for display by century farms and ranches; and 15Whereas the Oregon Century Farm and Ranch Program provides people of all ages with 16 knowledge and awareness of the social and economic impact of agriculture; and 17 Whereas the Oregon Century Farm and Ranch Program acknowledges the role that family farms 18 and ranches play in providing stability to their communities; and Whereas the Oregon Century Farm and Ranch Program has become a storyteller for Oregon's 19 20 farm and ranch families; and 21Whereas all of the Oregon Century Farm and Ranch Program's accompanying documentation 22and photos are included in the Oregon Historical Society research library; and 23Whereas the documentation and photos provide valuable information about settlement patterns, 24 livestock and crop choices and the history of Oregon farming and ranching; and 25Whereas the Oregon Century Farm and Ranch Program reflects the image of Oregon independ-26 ence and self-sufficiency; and 27Whereas there are now families that have continuously owned and operated the same Oregon 28farms and ranches for more than 150 years; and 29 Whereas the Oregon Century Farm and Ranch Program also recognizes and honors farm and 30 ranch families that have continuously owned and operated the same Oregon farms and ranches for

1 150 or more years; now, therefore,
