Measure Description:

Allows a merged school district exceeding 8,500 weighted students to continue to qualify for small high school additional student weight in the school equalization formula for 4 years. Applies to a small high school that qualifies prior to merger but would become disqualified because the weighted students of the merged district exceeds the limit of 8,500. Takes effect on passage.

Impact Explanation:

There is no initial impact. If there is a future merger such as Klamath County and Klamath City school districts, the bill would allow the merged district to maintain small high school additional student weight. Small high school weighted students and district funding would not decrease because of the merged district's size. Consequently school formula revenue would not shift from the merged district to all other school districts.
