WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Creates a reporting requirement for offenders who move into the state and who work at, or attend, an institution of higher learning but who are not currently required to register.

## **ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

Provisions of the measure

## **EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:** No amendment.

**BACKGROUND:** ORS 181.597 applies to offenders who were convicted in another jurisdiction and who are not otherwise required to register under ORS 181.595 or 181.596. Under the current statute, when an offender lives in another state, but attends school or works in Oregon, the person is required to register. However, there is a gap in the law such that a person who moves into the state of Oregon and attends school, or gets a job at an institution of higher learning, does not have to register. This measure addresses that discrepancy by providing that they are required to register within 10 days of the first day of school or the 14<sup>th</sup> day of employment. Thereafter they have to report after any change in school attendance or employment.
