EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: No amendment.

BACKGROUND: Measure clarifies where people must file their petition for relief. Petition must be filed in circuit court of the county in which person was convicted. If conviction occurred in another state, then petition must be filed in county where person now resides.
