**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:** Allows law enforcement agency to remove hidden compartment from a vehicle that has been forfeited and to be reimbursed for expense associated with removal out of proceeds of selling the vehicle.

## **ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

- Breadth of forfeiture statues
- Proceeds or instrumentalities of crime
- Definition of "hidden compartment"

**EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:** Replaces the measure.

**BACKGROUND:** Currently, there are civil and criminal forfeiture statutes. When a vehicle with a hidden compartment is forfeited, law enforcement agencies remove the compartment before selling or disposing of the vehicle. House Bill 2403A provides a process for law enforcement agencies to recoup the cost of removing these compartments.
