## **ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

## **EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:** No amendment.

**BACKGROUND:** The Westside Express Service (WES) is Oregon's first commuter rail line. The partners are Washington County, TriMet, Metro, the Oregon Department of Transportation, and the Cities of Beaverton, Tigard, Tualatin, and Wilsonville. Following approximately ten years of planning and implement, WES began service on February 2, 2009. WES runs weekdays during the morning and afternoon rush hours, using self-propelled railcars to serve 14.7 miles of track between Beaverton and Wilsonville. Portland & Western Railroad owns the rail tracks and operates the train, while TriMet owns and maintains the train cars.

HB 2408-A is intended to begin the planning process for possible extension of WES commuter rail to Salem.
