**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:** Allows the Oregon Liquor Control Commission to issue special events licenses to brewery-public house licensees.

**ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

- Provisions of the measure

**EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:** No amendment.

**BACKGROUND:** The Oregon Liquor Control Commission (OLCC) issues special events licenses to winery and grower licensees who are selling wine or cider for drinking on the special event premises or in sealed containers for off-premises consumption. The permits are designed for events open to the public with an anticipated attendance of more than 300 people. Temporary sales licenses are treated in the same fashion. However, current statute does not extend the same privilege to brewery-public house (brewpub) licensees. Brewpubs must apply for temporary sales permits in order to hold similar events.

HB 2528 authorizes special events licenses for brewery-public house licensees, with the same conditions as current special events licenses issued to wineries: \$10 per day and no longer than five days.
