**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:** Increases fines for committing crimes of interfering with, or assaulting, a police animal.

## **ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

- Impact of police animals on crime
- Penalty for assaulting a police officer
- Fiscal impact

**EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:** Replaces the measure.

**BACKGROUND:** HB 2629A increases the fines associated with a conviction for interfering with, or assaulting, a police animal. Interfering with a police animal is a Class A misdemeanor and assaulting a police animal is a Class C felony. In the event a defendant is convicted of either crime, this measure requires a judge to impose \$500 fine for a misdemeanor and a \$1,000 fine for a felony.
