WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Exempts employees of the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) from criminal charges if, in the scope of employment, the employee possesses or discharges a firearm during a lawful taking of wildlife.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

Provisions of the measure

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: No amendment.

BACKGROUND: Currently, USDA wildlife officers may not be exempt from the prohibition not to discharge a firearm within a city or county limit. HB 2636A is meant to increase efficiency by not requiring multiple, local first-responders to be removed from other duties to address limited situations involving the lawful taking of wildlife that could potentially be resolved by a USDA employee, while also protecting the USDA employee from a potential criminal charge
