WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Prohibits use of computer software designed to circumvent equitable distribution of admission tickets for entertainment events. Makes use of software unlawful trade practice.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Technology of ticket software
- Equitable ticket distribution

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: No amendment.

BACKGROUND: Consumers purchasing tickets to entertainment events may be told that tickets have sold out when tickets have actually been purchased by secondary resellers using software designed to thwart a seller's efforts to limit the number of tickets a ticket purchaser may acquire. The software may also direct consumers to a reseller's web site offering tickets at inflated prices. House Bill 2673A prohibits the use of the software and makes its use an unlawful trade practice.
