WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Extends metropolitan service district jurisdiction to urban growth boundary automatically upon expansion of the urban growth boundary.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Two separate processes that achieve different results for two separate boundaries that should be identical
- Special districts tried to anticipate expansion of urban growth boundaries, and so set boundaries slightly beyond
- Not annexation into a city
- Need to be brought into sync and streamlined into one process

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: Removes language allowing extension of metropolitan service district jurisdiction to current urban growth boundary upon passage of the measure, making the bill prospective only.

BACKGROUND: Currently, two separate processes must be undertaken to govern planning and the provision of services; the process to expand an urban growth boundary, and then a separate process to expand the jurisdiction of the service district to match that boundary. House Bill 3043-A allows both to be accomplished in one process.
