WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Requires school district (District) to submit a written plan of instruction for talented and gifted (TAG) children to the Superintendent of Public Education (Superintendent). Permits a District to apply for state funds for TAG programs by submitting an application to the Superintendent. Requires funds specifically appropriated for TAG programs be distributed only to Districts with approved applications. Provides the measure first applies to the 2009-2010 school year. Declares an emergency; effective July 1, 2009.
