WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Makes a specified health insurance coverage requirement exempt from an automatic six-year sunset provision.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Provisions requiring coverage automatically sunset in 2006; this measure would reinstate language
- Applies to highly specialized and expensive formulas primarily for infants and children who may not be able to tolerate any other form of nutrition
- Children in poverty are often covered by programs such as Medicaid and Women, Infants and Children (WIC), while insurance available to middle-income families may not include such coverage
- Good nutrition critical to growth and development

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: No amendment.

BACKGROUND: House Bill 3496 prevents the automatic sunset of the requirement for certain health insurance to cover nonprescription elemental enteral formula for treatment of severe intestinal malabsorption.
