**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:** Repeals statute permitting school districts with child development specialist programs to seek reimbursement for associated costs. Declares an emergency; effective upon passage.

## **ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

- Budget used to pay child development specialists
- · Availability of state funding for child development specialist reimbursement

## **EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:** No amendment.

**BACKGROUND:** Child development specialists provide primary prevention services directly or in cooperation with others in settings in addition to school settings. The Department of Education reports that it has not received a reimbursement request for established child development specialist programs since the 1991-1992 school year. State funds have not been allocated to the department to provide reimbursement for at least 17 years. SB 63 would not change a district's option to establish child development specialist programs.
